House Bill 2059

Sponsored by Representative NOSSE (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells OHA to create a unit focused on building new mental health and SUD facilities. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.1).

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to establish a unit dedicated to developing sufficient adult behavioral health facilities to serve the needs of each trauma system area in this state. Sunsets on January 2, 2031.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

 $\mathbf{2}$ Relating to adult behavioral health facilities.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

4 SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "adult behavioral health facility" means:

5 (a) An inpatient psychiatric facility, including the Oregon State Hospital;

(b) An inpatient psychiatric unit in a hospital; 6

7 (c) A residential treatment facility as defined in ORS 443.400;

8 (d) A secure residential treatment facility as described in ORS 443.465;

(e) A residential treatment home as defined in ORS 443.400; 9

(f) An adult foster home as defined in ORS 443.705 that serves individuals with mental 10 illness; 11

12 (g) A residential substance use disorder treatment program, including a withdrawal 13 management program; and

(h) A crisis facility, as defined by the Oregon Health Authority by rule. 14

15(2) The Oregon Health Authority shall establish a unit within the authority dedicated to developing sufficient adult behavioral health facilities to ensure that each trauma system 16 area, as identified by the authority by rule, has the number and types of adult behavioral 17 health facilities needed to serve the trauma system area's population. 18

19 (3)(a) The unit established under this section shall develop plans for and provide funding 20for the construction and staffing of new adult behavioral health facilities.

21(b) In developing plans under this subsection, the unit shall:

22(A) Use a phased approach that takes into account the priorities of each trauma system

23area, construction time frames and costs and staffing needs; and

- 24(B) Collaborate with:
- 25(i) Local public health authorities as defined in ORS 431.003;
- 26 (ii) Community mental health programs;
- 27(iii) Hospitals;

(iv) Treatment providers at adult behavioral health facilities; 28

29 (v) Education service districts;

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1 (vi) Coordinated care organizations as defined in ORS 414.025; and

2 (vii) Other relevant stakeholders, as needed.

3 (4) Beginning in 2026, the authority shall submit a report no later than September 15 of

each year, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, to the interim committees of the Legis lative Assembly related to health and shall describe the progress of the unit in achieving the

6 requirements of this section.

7 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2031.

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
