House Bill 2201

Sponsored by Representative SCHARF (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act allows for delivery of gas on the go. (Flesch Readability Score: 78.2). Directs the State Fire Marshal to adopt standards that may be used by local governments to issue certificates for the purpose of authorizing mobile on-demand fueling.

2	Relating to mobile on-demand fueling.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 480.310 to
5	480.385.
6	SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:
7	(a) "Local government" has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.116.
8	(b) "Mobile on-demand fueling" means dispensing Class 1, 2 or 3 flammable liquids into
9	the fuel tanks of motor vehicles.
10	(c) "Mobile on-demand fueling motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle that has been cer-
11	tified by a local government to provide mobile on-demand fueling to customers and has met
12	the standards established under this section.
13	(d) "Mobile on-demand fueling operator" means a person who has been certified by a local
14	government to provide mobile on-demand fueling to customers and has and met the stan-
15	dards established under this section.
16	(2) Notwithstanding any restriction in ORS 480.310 to 480.385, a local government may
17	provide certificates described in subsection (3) of this section. Any ordinance adopted shall
18	conform to the standards established by the State Fire Marshal under this section and may
19	include additional provisions as required by local ordinances.
20	(3) The State Fire Marshal shall adopt standards and advise local governments with re-
21	spect to the criteria for issuing mobile on-demand fueling operator certificates and mobile
22	on-demand fueling motor vehicle certificates.
23	(4) The State Fire Marshal shall provide recommendations to local governments on:
24	(a) Establishing timely and consistent requirements for issuing mobile on-demand fueling
25	operator certificates and mobile on-demand fueling motor vehicle certificates;
26	(b) Procedures for eliminating redundancies and improving efficiency across Oregon;
27	(c) Recommendations for reciprocal acceptance of certificates among local governments
28	in Oregon;
29	(d) Processes that do not require multiple and substantially similar inspections of a par-
30	ticular vehicle for the vehicle to operate in multiple jurisdictions;

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1 (e) Standards for vehicle requirements; and

2 (f) Any other recommendations of the State Fire Marshal related to mobile on-demand 3 fueling in Oregon.

4 (5) A local government may charge a fee to cover the costs of issuing certificates, in-5 spections or other administrative costs related to carrying out the authority under this 6 section.

7 (6) The State Fire Marshal and local governments shall take into consideration the 8 International Fire Code regulations related to mobile on-demand fueling when adopting 9 standards under this section.

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
