| 11 | "(b) A mental disorder other than a qualifying mental disorder is not the primary cause |
| 12 | of the lack of substantial capacity; and |
| 13 | "(c) The lack of substantial capacity is not the result of voluntary intoxication in com- |
| 14 | bination with a qualifying mental disorder, a mental disorder other than a qualifying mental |
| 15 | disorder or both. |
| 16 | "(2) As used in chapter 743, Oregon Laws 1971, the term 'qualifying mental disorder' does not |
| 17 | include an abnormality manifested only by repeated criminal or otherwise antisocial conduct, nor |
| 18 | does the term include any abnormality constituting solely a personality disorder. |
| 19 | "SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 161.295 by section 1 of this 2025 Act apply to |
| 20 | conduct occurring on or after the effective date of this 2025 Act. |
| 21 | "SECTION 3. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public |
| 22 | peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect |
| 23 | on its passage.". |
