

House Bill 2503

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of Joint Interim Committee on Addiction and Community Safety Response for Representative Jason Kropf)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs the CJC to study rates of drug crime recidivism. (Flesch Readability Score: 74.8).

Requires the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study the effect on rates of recidivism of different dispositional outcomes for drug enforcement misdemeanor charges. Directs the commission to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary not later than September 15, 2026.

Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to controlled substance offenses.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall study how different dispositional outcomes for drug enforcement misdemeanor charges affect rates of recidivism. The commission shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary no later than September 15, 2026.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.
