

House Bill 2617

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Representative Jason Kropf)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs the DOJ to do a study. (Flesch Readability Score: 80.3).

Directs the Department of Justice to study possible modifications to post-conviction relief proceeding procedures to increase efficiency, and provide the results of the study to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.

Sunsets January 2, 2027.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to post-conviction relief.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Justice shall study possible modifications to post-**
5 **conviction relief proceeding procedures to increase efficiency.**

6 **(2) The department shall provide the results of the study, including any recommended**
7 **legislative changes, in a report to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative As-**
8 **sembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 no later than December 31, 2026.**

9 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.**
