SUMMARY

It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: Removes the ban on offering gifts worth more than \$50 in a calendar year to certain

people. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.1). Removes the prohibition on offering gifts in excess of \$50 per calendar year to a public official, candidate, or relative or member of the household of a public official or candidate.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to gift limits; amending ORS 244.025. 2

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

SECTION 1. ORS 244.025 is amended to read:

244.025. (1) During a calendar year, a public official, a candidate or a relative or member of the 5

household of the public official or candidate may not solicit or receive, directly or indirectly, any 6

7 gift or gifts with an aggregate value in excess of \$50 from any single source that could reasonably

8 be known to have a legislative or administrative interest.

9 [(2) During a calendar year, a person who has a legislative or administrative interest may not offer to the public official or a relative or member of the household of the public official any gift or gifts 10

with an aggregate value in excess of \$50.] 11

12 [(3) During a calendar year, a person who has a legislative or administrative interest may not offer to the candidate or a relative or member of the household of the candidate any gift or gifts with an 13aggregate value in excess of \$50.] 14

15[(4)] (2) This section does not apply to public officials subject to the Oregon Code of Judicial Conduct. 16
