## **A-Engrossed** House Bill 2997

Ordered by the House March 24 Including House Amendments dated March 24

Sponsored by Representative RUIZ, Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act requires HECC to create a grant program for college access and success. The Act sets the criteria for a grant to be given. (Flesch Readability Score: 79.0).

Requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish a grant program for the purpose of supporting organizations to expand the scope and community reach of college access and success programs. Details the eligibility criteria to receive a grant and the factors the commission must consider when awarding grants. Appropriates moneys to the commission for purposes of the program.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

<b>2</b>	Relating to higher education; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall establish a grant
5	program for the purpose of supporting organizations to expand the scope and community
6	reach of college access and success programs.
7	(2) In order to be eligible to receive a grant under this section, an organization must:
8	(a) Be a not-for-profit corporation that is tax exempt under section 501(c) of the Internal
9	Revenue Code;
10	(b) Be a community-based organization; or
11	(c) Be a public institution of higher education as defined in ORS 350.260.
12	(3) In awarding grants under this section, the commission shall consider whether an eli-
13	gible organization under subsection (2) of this section has a demonstrated history of provid-
14	ing:
15	(a) Successful college access and success programs; and
16	(b) Programs and services to populations that are historically underserved in post-
17	secondary institutions of education.
18	(4) The commission shall adopt any rules necessary for the administration of this section,
19	including any rules related to:
20	(a) Specifying the form and timelines for submitting an application for a grant under this
21	section;
22	(b) Determining whether an organization is eligible for a grant under this section;
23	(c) Calculating the amount to award to grant recipients under this section; and
24	(d) Collecting data required to evaluate program effectiveness.
25	SECTION 2. There is appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for

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- 1 the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000 for
- 2 the purpose of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2025 Act.
- 3 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
- 4 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect
  5 on its passage.

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
