

House Bill 3100

Sponsored by Representative NGUYEN D; Representatives MCLAIN, PHAM H, Senators JAMA, MEEK, WOODS
(Pre-session filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act would give lottery funds to Business Oregon to craft a trade strategy for this state. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.1).

Allocates lottery funds to the Oregon Business Development Department to develop a unified trade strategy for Oregon in collaboration with the Port of Portland, the Oregon Tourism Commission, the State Department of Agriculture and other stakeholders.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to a unified trade strategy for Oregon; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, from the Ad-**
5 **ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Business Development**
6 **Department, the amount of \$3,200,000 for the purposes set forth in subsection (2) of this**
7 **section.**

8 **(2) The Oregon Business Development Department, in collaboration with the Port of**
9 **Portland, the Oregon Tourism Commission, the State Department of Agriculture and other**
10 **stakeholders selected by the Oregon Business Development Department, shall develop a**
11 **unified trade strategy for Oregon, including, but not limited to:**

12 **(a) Hiring consultants to represent Oregon in foreign markets;**

13 **(b) Supporting outbound and inbound trade missions for government and businesses;**

14 **(c) Expanding the promotion of Oregon exports and foreign direct investment in Oregon;**

15 **and**

16 **(d) Providing technical assistance to Oregon businesses impacted by foreign tariffs.**

17 **SECTION 2. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
18 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect**
19 **on its passage.**
