HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3216

1	On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, after the first semicolon delete the rest of the line and line
2	4 and insert "and declaring an emergency.".
3	Delete lines 6 through 26 and delete pages 2 through 9 and insert:
4	"SECTION 1. (1) The Bureau of Labor and Industries shall study the feasibility of devel-
5	oping a centralized system for contractors to submit and the bureau to receive certified
6	statements required under ORS 279C.845. In conducting the study, the bureau shall:
7	"(a) Evaluate the feasibility of developing a system that:
8	"(A) Allows contractors to submit certified statements directly to the bureau rather than
9	to the public agency with which the contractor has a contract for public works;
10	"(B) Is entirely online, with capability to submit certified statements by means of a mo-
11	bile device or a web-based portal; and
12	"(C) Allows public agencies inside and outside this state to retrieve or have access to
13	certified statements for lawful purposes.
14	"(b) Review online and electronic systems that other states use for the same or a similar
15	function and, where useful, consult with officials in other states to determine how the other
16	systems implement such features as submission, storage and retrieval of information, ease
17	of use and facilitation of oversight over compliance with the requirement to pay a prevailing
18	rate of wage.
19	"(c) Determine how to ensure that confidential information that contractors submit, or
20	that is stored on or is retrievable from the system, remains confidential.
21	"(d) Estimate the cost of developing, implementing and maintaining the system and
22	identify a feasible source of funding for that purpose.
23	"(e) Evaluate the security features necessary for the system to implement secure sub-
24	mission, storage and retrieval of information.
25	"(f) Consult with public agencies, contractors and other persons who participate in the
26	reporting system required under ORS 279C.845 to identify features, obstacles, challenges and
27	benefits of a new centralized, online reporting system.
28	"(2) The bureau shall submit to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly re-
29	lated to public procurement a report detailing the results of the bureau's study, along with
30	recommendations for any legislation necessary to implement the system described in sub-
31	section (1) of this section. The bureau shall submit the report by December 31, 2025, unless
32	the study requires additional time, in which case the bureau shall submit by that date a re-
33	port that describes progress on the study. The bureau shall submit a final report and rec-
34	ommendation not later than September 1, 2026.
35	"(3) If necessary, the bureau may contract with another person under ORS 279B.075,

279B.080 or 279B.085, as appropriate, to conduct or assist in conducting the study described
in subsection (1) of this section. This subsection is authority for the bureau to determine
that conducting a sole-source, emergency or special procurement, as appropriate, is in the
public interest.
<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.
<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

7 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect 8 on its passage.".
