## **A-Engrossed** House Bill 3239

Ordered by the House March 25 Including House Amendments dated March 25

Sponsored by Representative NATHANSON, Senator GELSER BLOUIN; Representatives PHAM H, WALLAN (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act gives funds to DHS, OHA and OSP to do programs about criminal records

**checks.** (Flesch Readability Score: 74.2). [Digest: The Act gives funds to DHS and OSP to do programs about criminal records checks. (Flesch Readability Score: 78.8).]

Appropriates moneys to and limits expenditures by the Department of Human Services, the Oregon Health Authority and the Department of State Police for implementation of programs related to criminal records checks, including the Rap Back program.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

11	ments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$17,245,820, which may be expended for
12	participation by the background check unit of the department in the Rap Back program, as
13	defined in ORS 181A.205.

20	penses for participation by the background check unit of the Department of Human Services
21	in the Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205, from federal funds collected or re-
