6 **“SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation**
7 **made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (2), chapter _____, Oregon Laws**
8 **2025 (Enrolled Senate Bill 5526), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, for state assess-**
9 **ments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$17,245,820, which may be expended for**
10 **participation by the background check unit of the department in the Rap Back program, as**
11 **defined in ORS 181A.205.**

15 **“SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
16 **expenditures established by section 3 (2), chapter _____, Oregon Laws 2025 (Enrolled Senate**
17 **Bill 5526), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-**
18 **penditures for participation by the background check unit of the Department of Human Services**
19 **in the Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205, from federal funds collected or re-**
20 **ceived by the department for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by**
21 **\$11,808,047.**

28 **penditures for participation by the background check unit of the Department of Human Services**
29 **in the Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205, from fees, moneys or other revenues,**
30 **including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or**
31 **received by the department, for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased**
32 **by \$4,349,716.**

33 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
34 **expenditures established by section 2 (8), chapter _____, Oregon Laws 2025 (Enrolled Senate**
35 **Bill 5526), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-**

1 penses for participation by the background check unit of the Department of Human Services
2 in the Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205, from fees, moneys or other revenues,
3 including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or
4 received by the department, for shared services, is increased by \$36,770,115.

9 **“SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
10 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (7), chapter ____, Oregon Laws 2025
11 (Enrolled House Bill 5025), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, for state assessments and
12 enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$2,154,303, which may be expended for subsidizing the
13 costs to employees of criminal records checks.

15 **“(Federal Funds Expenditure Limitation)**

17 **“SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
18 expenditures established by section 5 (7), chapter ____, Oregon Laws 2025 (Enrolled House
19 Bill 5025), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-
20 penses for participation by the background check unit of the Oregon Health Authority in the
21 Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205, from federal funds collected or received by
22 the authority for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$1,027,135.

26 **“SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
27 expenditures established by section 2 (9), chapter ____, Oregon Laws 2025 (Enrolled House
28 Bill 5025), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-
29 penses for participation by the background check unit of the Oregon Health Authority in the
30 Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205, from fees, moneys or other revenues, in-
31 cluding Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or
32 received by the authority, for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by
33 \$185,094.

38 **“SECTION 8.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
39 priated to the Department of State Police, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the
40 General Fund, the amount of \$_____, which may be expended for implementing the Rap
41 Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205.

43 **“(Federal Funds Expenditure Limitation)**

45 **“SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of

1 \$_____ is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for
2 payment of expenses for implementing the Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205,
3 from federal funds collected or received by the Department of State Police.

7 **“SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
8 **\$15,866,481 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for**
9 **payment of expenses for implementing the Rap Back program, as defined in ORS 181A.205,**
10 **from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery**
11 **funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police.**
