SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells OHA to study how to calculate a CCO's global budget. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.9).

[Digest: The Act tells OHA to create a method for calculating a CCO's global budget. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).]

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to *[develop]* **study** a methodology for calculating a coordinated care organization's global budget **and report the authority's findings to the Legislative Assembly.**

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to coordinated care organization global budgets; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "coordinated care organization" and "global**

5 **budget" have the meanings given those terms in ORS 414.025.**

6 **(2) The Oregon Health Authority shall study a methodology for calculating a coordinated**

7 **care organization's global budget that takes into consideration a coordinated care**

8 **organization's investments in:**

9 **(a) Improving health outcomes for the coordinated care organization's members;**

10 **(b) Improving the quality of and access to care;**

11 **(c) Reducing the delivery of inefficient and ineffectual care; and**

12 **(d) Improving community health.**

13 **(3) No later than December 31, 2025, the authority shall report to the interim committees**

14 **of the Legislative Assembly related to health, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, the**

15 **authority's findings from the study conducted under subsection (2) of this section. The report**

16 **may include recommendations for legislative changes.**

17 **SECTION 2. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**

18 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect**

19 **on its passage.**
