House Bill 3436

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act bars a city from making a property owner pay to cut down a tree on public property or to fix a sidewalk for damage from such a tree. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.7).

Prohibits a city from requiring a property owner to pay for the removal of a tree from public property or repairs to a public sidewalk damaged by a tree on public property.

Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to costs associated with trees on public property; and prescribing an effective date. 2

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the city's charter, or any other provision of law, a city may 4

5 not require a property owner to:

6 (1) Remove, or pay for the removal of, a tree or other natural growth from public prop-7 erty; or

8 (2) Repair, or pay for repairs to, a public sidewalk damaged by a tree or other natural

9 growth on public property.

10 SECTION 2. This 2025 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2025 regular session of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die. 11

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
