

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3626

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 4, delete “, 815.280”.

2 On page 7, delete lines 3 through 45.

3 On page 8, delete lines 1 through 42 and insert:

4 “**SECTION 8.** ORS 807.020, as amended by section 3, chapter 12, Oregon Laws 2024, is amended
5 to read:

6 “807.020. A person who is granted a driving privilege by this section may exercise the driving
7 privilege described without violation of the requirements under ORS 807.010. A grant of driving
8 privileges to operate a motor vehicle under this section is subject to suspension and revocation the
9 same as other driving privileges granted under the vehicle code. This section is in addition to any
10 exemptions from the vehicle code under ORS 801.026. The following persons are granted the de-
11 scribed driving privileges:

12 “(1) A person who is not a resident of this state or who has been a resident of this state for less
13 than 30 days may operate a motor vehicle without an Oregon license or driver permit if the person
14 holds a current out-of-state license issued to the person. For the purpose of this subsection, a person
15 is a resident of this state if the person meets the residency requirements described in ORS 807.062.
16 To qualify under this subsection, the person must have the out-of-state license or driver permit in
17 the person’s possession. A person is not granted driving privileges under this subsection:

18 “(a) If the person is under the minimum age required to be eligible for driving privileges under
19 ORS 807.060;

20 “(b) During a period of suspension or revocation by this state or any other jurisdiction of driv-
21 ing privileges or of the right to apply for a license or driver permit issued by this state or any other
22 jurisdiction; or

23 “(c) That exceed the driving privileges granted to the person by the out-of-state license or driver
24 permit.

25 “(2) A person who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States or a member of the
26 commissioned corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration may operate a motor
27 vehicle without an Oregon license or driver permit if the person is operating a motor vehicle in the
28 course of the person’s duties in the Armed Forces or the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad-
29 ministration.

30 “(3) A person without a license or driver permit may operate a road roller or road machinery
31 that is not required to be registered under the laws of this state.

32 “(4) A person without a license or driver permit may temporarily operate, draw, move or propel
33 a farm tractor or implement of husbandry.

34 “(5) A person without a license or driver permit may operate a motor vehicle to demonstrate
35 driving ability during the course of an examination administered under ORS 807.070 for the purpose

1 of qualifying for a license or driver permit. This subsection only applies when an authorized exam-
2 iner is in a seat beside the driver of the motor vehicle.

3 “(6) Driving privileges for snowmobiles are exclusively as provided in ORS 821.150.

4 “(7) Driving privileges for Class I all-terrain vehicles are exclusively as provided in ORS 821.170,
5 unless a person is operating a Class I all-terrain vehicle on an all-terrain vehicle highway access
6 route that is designated by the Oregon Transportation Commission as open to all-terrain vehicles.

7 “(8) Driving privileges for Class III all-terrain vehicles are exclusively as provided in ORS
8 821.172, unless a person is operating a Class III all-terrain vehicle on an all-terrain vehicle highway
9 access route that is designated by the commission as open to all-terrain vehicles.

10 “(9) Driving privileges for Class IV all-terrain vehicles are exclusively as provided in ORS
11 821.176, unless a person is operating a Class IV all-terrain vehicle on an all-terrain vehicle highway
12 access route that is designated by the commission as open to all-terrain vehicles.

13 “(10) A person without a license or driver permit may operate a golf cart in accordance with
14 an ordinance adopted under ORS 810.070.

15 “(11) The spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States on active duty or the
16 spouse of a member of the commissioned corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-
17 tration who is accompanying the member on assignment in this state may operate a motor vehicle
18 if the spouse has a current out-of-state license or driver permit issued to the spouse by another state
19 in the spouse’s possession.

20 “(12) A person who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States on active duty or a
21 member of the commissioned corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration may
22 operate a motor vehicle if the person has a current out-of-state license or driver permit in the
23 person’s possession that is issued to the person by the person’s state of domicile or by the Armed
24 Forces of the United States in a foreign country. Driving privileges described under this subsection
25 that are granted by the Armed Forces apply only for a period of 45 days from the time the person
26 returns to the United States.

27 “(13) A person who does not hold a motorcycle endorsement may operate a motorcycle if the
28 person is:

29 “(a) Within an enclosed cab;

30 “(b) Operating a vehicle designed to travel with three wheels in contact with the ground at
31 speeds of less than 15 miles per hour; or

32 “(c) Operating an autocycle.

33 “(14) Except as provided in subsection (15) of this section, a person may operate a bicycle
34 without any grant of driving privileges.

35 “(15) A person may operate the following without any grant of driving privileges if the person
36 is *[16 years of age or older]* **operating**:

37 “(a) A Class 1 electric assisted bicycle **and is 14 years of age or older**;

38 “(b) A Class 2 electric assisted bicycle **and is 16 years of age or older**; or

39 “(c) A Class 3 electric assisted bicycle **and is 16 years of age or older**.

40 “(16) A person may operate a motor assisted scooter without *[a driver license or driver permit]*
41 **any grant of driving privileges** if the person is 16 years of age or older.

42 “(17) A person who is not a resident of this state or who has been a resident of this state for
43 less than 30 days may operate a motor vehicle without an Oregon license or driver permit if the
44 person is at least 15 years of age and has in the person’s possession a current out-of-state equivalent
45 of a Class C instruction driver permit issued to the person. For the purpose of this subsection, a

1 person is a resident of this state if the person meets the residency requirements described in ORS
2 807.062. A person operating a motor vehicle under authority of this subsection has the same privi-
3 leges and is subject to the same restrictions as a person operating under the authority of a Class
4 C instruction driver permit issued as provided in ORS 807.280.

5 “(18) A person may operate an electric personal assistive mobility device without any grant of
6 driving privileges if the person is 16 years of age or older.

7 **“(19) A person may operate a powered micromobility device without any grant of driving**
8 **privileges if the person is 16 years of age or older.”.**

9 On page 10, delete lines 1 and 2.

10 In line 3, delete “(3)” and insert “(2)”.

11 Delete lines 17 and 18.

12 In line 19, delete “(3)” and insert “(2)”.

13 In line 25, restore “(3)” and delete “(4)”.

14 On page 11, delete lines 26 through 45.

15 On page 12, delete lines 1 through 14 and insert:

16 **“NOTE:** Section 19 was deleted by amendment. Subsequent sections were not renumbered.”.

17 In line 20, after “shall” insert “develop a safety education program and”.
