## House Bill 3729

Sponsored by Representative MCINTIRE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: This Act says that a person does not have to do cremations at more than 1600 degrees Fahrenheit. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.6).

Prohibits the Department of Environmental Quality, the Environmental Quality Commission or a regional air quality control authority from requiring a person to operate a human or animal crematory incinerator at a temperature greater than 1,600 degrees Fahrenheit.

Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to crematory incinerators; and prescribing an effective date.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 468A.

5 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the Department of Environ-

6 mental Quality, the Environmental Quality Commission or a regional air quality control au-

7 thority formed under ORS 468A.105 may not adopt or enforce any rule or standard that

8 requires a person to operate a human or animal crematory incinerator at a temperature

9 greater than 1,600 degrees Fahrenheit.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2025 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2025
regular session of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
