

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3731

By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon insert “creating new provisions;”.  
2 Delete lines 5 through 29 and delete page 2 and insert:

3 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 350.345, as amended by section 7, chapter 46, Oregon Laws 2024, is amended  
4 to read:

5 “350.345. (1) No later than October 1 of each year, each institution of higher education shall  
6 submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245 to:

7 “(a) The Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives;

8 “(b) The interim committees of the Legislative Assembly relating to higher education;

9 “(c) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission; and

10 “(d) The Director of Human Services.

11 “(2) [*Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section,*] The report shall include **the following**  
12 **information, along with an optional narrative section for each of the following in which the**  
13 **institution may, at its discretion, explain the information:**

14 “(a) The total number of allegations of sexual misconduct **during the previous academic year**  
15 that were reported to the institution’s Title IX coordinator by a student or employee of the institu-  
16 tion against:

17 “(A) Another student or employee of the institution [*during the previous academic year*]; **or**

18 “(B) **An unknown individual or an individual for whom the institution categorizes the**  
19 **report as ‘other.’**

20 “(b) The number of law enforcement investigations known to have been initiated during the  
21 previous academic year in response to reports of sexual misconduct that were brought forward by  
22 a student or employee of the institution [*against another student or employee of the institution*];.

23 “(c) The number of students and employees at the institution who were found responsible during  
24 the previous academic year for violating the institution’s policies prohibiting sexual misconduct[;].

25 “(d) The number of students and employees at the institution who during the previous academic  
26 year, faced academic or employment disciplinary action due to having violated the institution’s pol-  
27 icies prohibiting sexual misconduct[;].

28 “(e) The number of students and employees at the institution who, during the previous academic  
29 year, were investigated, but found not responsible for having violated the institution’s policies pro-  
30 hibiting sexual misconduct[;]. **If the number under this paragraph exceeds eight, the report**  
31 **must include a narrative section describing why sexual misconduct cases were closed, in-**  
32 **cluding the most common reasons, and may also include campus-specific categories of rea-**  
33 **sons for each investigation being closed and a total number for each category.**

34 “(f) The number of [*students at the institution*] **complainants** who, during the previous academic  
35 year, requested supportive measures[;].

1 “(g) The number of supportive measures requested by each [student] **complainant** described in  
2 paragraph (f) of this subsection[;].

3 “(h) The number of supportive measures granted to each [student] **complainant** described in  
4 paragraph (f) of this subsection[;]. **The institution may use the optional narrative section that**  
5 **accompanies the number under this paragraph to describe the supportive measures provided**  
6 **to complainants, and to include, at the institution’s discretion, a list of supportive measures,**  
7 **including emergency housing, if available, offered by the institution, and the number of times**  
8 **each supportive measure was used.**

9 “[i] *The number of students during the previous academic year who took a leave of absence,*  
10 *transferred to a different institution of higher education or withdrew from the institution of higher ed-*  
11 *ucation;*]

12 “[j] (i) The number of students or employees of the institution who reported experiencing sex-  
13 ual misconduct at the institution but who declined to participate or requested no investigation[;  
14 and].

15 “[k] (j) The number of ongoing investigations into an accusation of sexual misconduct.

16 “(k) **The types of violence reported at the institution. For any institution with greater**  
17 **than eight reports under this paragraph, the institution shall provide a narrative section**  
18 **describing the types of sexual misconduct experienced on the campus of the institution and**  
19 **may also include any campus-specific categories of sexual misconduct experienced on the**  
20 **campus of the institution and the number of reports for each category.**

21 “(L) **A section for narrative discussion in which the institution may:**

22 “(A) **Describe any work being done at the institution to ensure the institution has accu-**  
23 **rate information;**

24 “(B) **Explain any trends and changes in data regarding the numbers being reported;**

25 “(C) **Discuss any supportive measures provided or potential gaps in supportive measures**  
26 **being provided; and**

27 “(D) **Discuss how the institution is working to eliminate sexual misconduct on the cam-**  
28 **pus of the institution.**

29 “[3] *A report submitted by a community college operated under ORS chapter 341 or a career*  
30 *school as defined in ORS 345.010 is not required to include the information described in subsection*  
31 *(2)(i) of this section.*]

32 “[4] (3) The information provided in the report must be provided in an anonymous and aggre-  
33 gate manner that complies with all state and federal privacy laws.

34 “(4) **Notwithstanding the page limit described in ORS 192.245 (1), the executive summary**  
35 **for a report submitted under this section has no page limit.**

36 “**SECTION 2. (1) Except as provided under subsection (2) of this section, the amendments**  
37 **to ORS 350.345 by section 1 of this 2025 Act first apply to reports submitted for the 2025-2026**  
38 **academic year.**

39 “(2) **The narrative section required by ORS 350.345 (2)(L), as amended by section 1 of this**  
40 **2025 Act, first applies to reports submitted for the 2024-2025 academic year.**

41 “**SECTION 3. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
42 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect**  
43 **on its passage.”.**
