## House Bill 3830

Sponsored by Representative RUIZ

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act says that a person's immigration or citizenship status does not matter to get a license from the state to do a job or to get some benefits from the state. The Act also says that a person does not have to use a SSN. (Flesch Readability Score: 73.1).

Prohibits a professional licensing board from denying issuance of an authorization issued by the professional licensing board to an individual based solely on the individual's immigration or citizenship status. Prohibits a professional licensing board from disclosing an applicant's or licensee's Social Security number, federal individual taxpayer identification number or federally issued iden-tification number except for specific purposes. Provides that an individual may not be denied a state or local public benefit based solely on the individual's immigration or citizenship status.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to immigration status; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 25.785. 2

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section: 4

(a) "Licensee" means an individual who holds an authorization from a professional li-5

censing board to provide an occupational or professional service. 6

7 (b) "Occupational or professional service" has the meaning given that term in ORS 670.400. 8

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(c) "Professional licensing board" has the meaning given that term in ORS 670.400.

10 (2) An individual who is not lawfully present in the United States is eligible for an authorization to provide an occupational or professional service. A professional licensing board 11 may not deny issuance of an authorization issued by the professional licensing board to an 12 individual solely on the basis of the individual's immigration or citizenship status. 13

(3) A professional licensing board may not disclose the Social Security number, federal 14 individual taxpayer identification number or other federally issued identification number of 15 an applicant for an authorization issued by the professional licensing board or a licensee of 16 17professional licensing board to a person other than an employee of the professional licensing board for any purpose except: 18

19 (a) Tax purposes;

- 20(b) Authorization purposes; or
- 21 (c) Enforcement of an order for payment of child support.

(4) A Social Security number, federal individual taxpayer identification number or other 22 23federally issued identification number provided to a professional licensing board by an appli-

cant for an authorization issued by the professional licensing board or a licensee of the pro-24

fessional licensing board is confidential and exempt from public disclosure under ORS 192.311 25

26to 192.478.

SECTION 2. An individual who is not lawfully present in the United States is eligible for 27

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1 a state or local public benefit, as defined in 8 U.S.C. 1621(c), and may not be denied a state

2 or local public benefit based solely on the individual's immigration or citizenship status.

3 **SECTION 3.** ORS 25.785 is amended to read:

25.785. (1) Subject to ORS 670.406 and section 1 of this 2025 Act, any state agency, board or
commission that is authorized to issue an occupational, professional, recreational or driver license,
certificate, permit or registration subject to suspension under ORS 25.750 to 25.783 shall require that
an individual's Social Security number be recorded on an application for, or form for renewal of, a
license, certificate, permit or registration and to the maximum extent feasible shall include the Social Security number in automated databases containing information about the individual.
(2) A state agency, board or commission described in subsection (1) of this section may accept

11 a written statement from an individual who has not been issued a Social Security number by the 12 United States Social Security Administration to fulfill the requirement in subsection (1) of this sec-13 tion.

(3) An individual may not submit to a state agency, board or commission a written statement
 described in subsection (2) of this section knowing the statement to be false.

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
