House Bill 3916

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells OHA to give grants for local health workforce development activities. The Act takes effect when the Governor signs it. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.9).

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to award grants to certain recipients for certain workforce development activities.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to funding for local health workforce development activities; and declaring an emergency. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 4 SECTION 1. There is appropriated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000 for the purpose of 5 carrying out the provisions of section 2 of this 2025 Act. 6 7 SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall award grants to address and support 8 workforce development needs and activities to each of the following recipients in amounts 9 to be disbursed, as follows: (a) To the Oregon Community Health Workers Association, \$1,500,000. 10 (b) To the Oregon Mobile Integrated Healthcare Coalition, \$1,500,000. 11 12 (c) To the Oregon Coalition of Local Health Officials, \$2,000,000. (2) Before issuing a grant to a recipient under subsection (1) of this section, the authority 13 shall enter into an agreement with each recipient that requires the recipient to apply the 14 15grant toward the activities specified under subsection (3) of this section. (3) Grants awarded under this section may be used only for the purposes of: 16 (a) Developing, facilitating or sponsoring workforce training programs; 17 (b) Advertising and administering scholarships to trainees participating in a workforce 18 19 training program; (c) Providing for wraparound supports, based on demonstrated need, for trainees who 20participate in a workforce training program, including but not limited to: 2122 (A) Child care; 23(B) Travel expenses; 24(C) Technology resources; 25(D) Wage replacement stipends; 26 (E) Licensing or certification fees; 27(F) Course materials; and (G) Student loan repayment assistance options for trainees participating in a workforce 28 29 training program;

1 (d) Providing professional development support to trainees following completion of a 2 workforce training program;

3 (e) Providing workforce development, retention and sustainability support to employer
 4 organizations; and

5 (f) Collecting data and reporting measurable outcomes for the activities supported 6 through awarded grants.

7 (4) The authority shall prescribe the form and process by which a recipient may apply for
8 and be awarded grants under this section.

9 (5) The authority shall require recipients of grants under this section to report 10 biannually to the authority on the progress of the workforce development activities.

11 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 12 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect 13 on its passage.
