

# House Bill 3952

Sponsored by Representatives DRAZAN, HELFRICH, LEVY B; Representatives LEWIS, MANNIX

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act gives money to the parole board to get rid of the sex offender risk assessment backlog. (Flesch Readability Score: 71.0).

Appropriates moneys to the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision for purposes of eliminating the backlog of sex offenders who have not yet been assessed and placed into a risk level.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to sex offender risk assessments.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$7,000,000, for purposes of eliminating the backlog of sex offenders who have not yet been assessed and placed into a risk level using the risk assessment methodology described in ORS 163A.100.**
