SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act creates an agency budget. (Flesch Readability Score: 73.8).

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by the department.

Limits biennial expenditures by the department from certain lottery moneys. Limits biennial expenditures by the department from federal funds.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares an emergency, effective July 1, 2025.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$53,912,517 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund for debt service and related costs for bonds issued in previous biennia.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$5,744,348 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses to support the county fairs in this state from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services that are deposited in the County Fair Account established under ORS 565.445.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$1,372,803 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the Chief Financial Office.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$163,911,525 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for purposes other than those specified in section 5 of this 2025 Act.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, the following expenditures by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services are not limited:

- (1) Expenditures from the Insurance Fund for acquiring and purchasing insurance or reinsurance, allocating and collecting premiums and paying claims for coverage pursuant to statutory authority.
- (2) Expenditures from the Mass Transit Assistance Account for payments described in ORS 291.407 to mass transit districts, transportation districts and service districts.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect July 1, 2025.
