House Concurrent Resolution 32

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

| 11 | Whereas the combination of Corgis' intelligence, speed, agility and low height off the ground |
| 12 | makes them outstanding herding dogs while allowing them to avoid the hooves of cattle; and |
| 13 | Whereas Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom adored Corgis, owning more than 30 during |
| 14 | her long reign, beginning with Susan in 1944; and |
| 15 | Whereas Corgis are absurdly cute and adorable, and their short legs, long bodies and expressive |
| 16 | faces make them irresistible; and |
| 17 | Whereas Corgis have an outsized personality, and they are full of confidence, charm and sass |
| 18 | despite their small stature; and |
| 19 | Whereas Corgis are friendly, loyal and affectionate dogs who form strong bonds with their hu- |
| 20 | mans and love to be part of a family; and |
| 21 | Whereas you can take the Corgi out of the pasture, but you can't take the herding instincts out |
| 22 | of the Corgi, and they love to "herd" their humans around the house and yard; and |
| 23 | Whereas every summer, hundreds of Corgis (and their humans) gather from all over the nation |
| 24 | on the Oregon coast for the iconic Corgi Beach Takeover, a daylong celebration of our beautiful |
| 25 | coast and of all things Corgi, which also raises thousands of dollars for the Oregon Humane Society; |
