Senate Bill 1041

Sponsored by Senator BONHAM

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells police to notify ICE when arresting a person for some drug crimes and limits pretrial release. The Act goes into effect when the Governor signs it. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.6).

Directs an arresting officer to notify federal immigration authorities when the officer arrests a person for delivery or manufacture of fentanyl. Limits pretrial release until the notification has occurred.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to persons arrested for fentanyl crimes; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 181A.820 and 181A.822 to 181A.829, when a person

5 is arrested for delivery or manufacture of fentanyl, the arresting officer shall immediately

6 notify federal immigration authorities.

7 (2) Notwithstanding ORS 135.230 to 135.290, a person arrested for delivery or manufacture

8 of fentanyl is not eligible for any form of release, except as required by the Oregon Consti-

9 tution, until the notification described in subsection (1) of this section has occurred and

10 federal immigration authorities have confirmed that the person does not need to be detained

11 for violating federal immigration law.

(3) As used in this section, "federal immigration authorities" means agents of the United
States Immigration and Customs Enforcement, or a successor agency, who receive reports

14 of and investigate violations of immigration law.

15 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 16 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect 17 on its passage.
