Senate Bill 1043

Sponsored by Senator BONHAM

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act restores a crime to the way the crime was before HB 3164 (2021). (Flesch Readability Score: 61.8).

Modifies the crime of interfering with a peace officer or parole and probation officer. Adds refusing to obey a lawful order as a way of committing the crime. Removes the prohibition on arresting or charging a person with the crime if the person is arrested or charged with another offense for the same conduct.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the crime of interfering with a peace officer or parole and probation officer; creating 3 new provisions; and amending ORS 162.247.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 162.247 is amended to read:

6 162.247. (1) A person commits the crime of interfering with a peace officer or parole and pro-

7 bation officer if the person, knowing that another person is a peace officer or a parole and probation

8 officer as defined in ORS 181A.355[,]:

9 (a) Intentionally [or knowingly] acts in a manner that prevents, or attempts to prevent, [the] a 10 peace officer or parole and probation officer from performing the lawful duties of the officer with

11 regards to another person; or [a criminal investigation]

12 (b) Refuses to obey a lawful order by the peace officer or parole and probation officer.

13 (2) Interfering with a peace officer or parole and probation officer is a Class A misdemeanor.

14 (3) This section does not apply in situations in which the person is engaging in:

15 (a) Activity that would constitute resisting arrest under ORS 162.315; or

16 (**b**) Passive resistance.

17 [(4) A person may not be arrested or charged under this section if the person is arrested or charged 18 for another offense based on the same conduct.]

19 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 162.247 by section 1 of this 2025 Act apply to conduct constituting or alleged to constitute an offense under ORS 162.247 occurring on or after the effective date of this 2025 Act.

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
