Senate Bill 1072

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells a county clerk to make sure a person's party is not changed when the person updates an address with ODOT, unless the person asks for the change. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.4).

Requires a county clerk to verify that a person's political party affiliation is not changed when the person updates that person's address with the Department of Transportation, unless the person has requested the change as provided by law.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to political party affiliation; amending ORS 247.017.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 247.017 is amended to read:

5 247.017. (1) The Secretary of State shall by rule establish a schedule by which the Department

6 of Transportation shall provide to the secretary electronic records containing the legal name, age,

7 residence and citizenship information for, and the electronic signature of, each person who meets

8 qualifications identified by the secretary by rule.

9 (2) Upon receiving the electronic record for, and electronic signature of, a person described in 10 subsection (1) of this section, the Secretary of State shall provide the information to the county 11 clerk of the county in which the person may be registered as an elector. The secretary or county 12 clerk shall notify each person of the process to:

13 (a) Decline being registered as an elector.

14 (b) Adopt a political party affiliation.

(3)(a) If a person notified under subsection (2) of this section does not decline to be registered as an elector within 21 calendar days after the Secretary of State or county clerk issues the notification, the person's electronic record and electronic signature submitted under subsection (1) of this section will constitute a completed registration card for the person for purposes of this chapter. The person shall be registered to vote if the county clerk determines that the person is qualified to vote under Article II, section 2, of the Oregon Constitution, and the person is not already registered to vote.

(b) For any person whose electronic record is provided to the Secretary of State under subsection (1) of this section because that person updated the person's residence address with the Department of Transportation, and that person is already registered to vote at the time the electronic record is provided, the county clerk shall verify that the person's political party affiliation is not changed unless the person has requested the change as provided in this chapter.

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(4) A county clerk may not send a ballot to, or add to an elector registration list, a person who

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meets eligibility requirements until at least 21 calendar days after the Secretary of State or county
 clerk provided notification to the person as described in subsection (2) of this section.

(5) In addition to providing electronic records to the Secretary of State under subsection (1) of
this section, the Department of Transportation may by rule develop, and require the availability or
use of, any form or application the department determines is necessary to ensure compliance with
the voter registration provisions of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-31).

7 (6) The Secretary of State shall adopt rules required to implement subsections (1) to (4) of this8 section.

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
