## Senate Bill 1106

Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Jason Gearhart)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act requires the court to order that a child who is at least five years old and the subject of a parenting time proceeding receive mental health care. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7). Requires the court in a parenting time proceeding to order that the child who is the subject of the proceeding receive mental health therapy if the child is at least 5 years old but less than 18 years old.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to mental health therapy for children in family law proceedings.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
    - SECTION 1. In any proceeding to establish or modify a judgment providing for parenting time with a child who is at least 5 years of age and less than 18 years of age, the court shall order the parties to ensure that the child receive mental health therapy. If the proceeding involves parenting time with a child under five years of age, the court may, at the court's discretion, require the parties to ensure that the child receive mental health therapy.
