

Senate Bill 1123

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act says that a person who is a court visitor is not liable for injuries that happen when the person is doing the things the court said to do. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.4).

Grants court visitors immunity from liability when acting in good faith and within the scope of the visitor's duties.

2 Relating to court visitors.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 25.**

5 **SECTION 2. A person appointed as a court visitor is immune from any liability for acts,**
6 **omissions or errors in judgment, if the act, omission or error in judgment is made in good**
7 **faith and within the scope of the person's duties, responsibilities or functions as a court**
8 **visitor.**
