

# A-Engrossed Senate Bill 1123

Ordered by the Senate March 26  
Including Senate Amendments dated March 26

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act says that a person who is a court visitor is not liable for injuries that happen when the person is doing the things the court said to do. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.4).

Grants court visitors immunity from liability when acting in good faith and within the scope of the visitor's duties.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to court visitors.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 125.**

**SECTION 2. A person appointed as a court visitor is immune from any liability for acts, omissions or errors in judgment, if the act, omission or error in judgment is made in good faith and within the scope of the person's duties, responsibilities or functions as a court visitor.**
