SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act would ban paying certain home health staff on a per-visit basis. (Flesch Readability Score: 76.5).

Prohibits per-visit compensation for home health care and home hospice care staff.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

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2 Relating to per-visit compensation for home health care entities; amending ORS 652.260.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 652.260 is amended to read:

- 6 (a) "Home health care staff" means individuals who provide home health services. "Home
- 7 health care staff" does not include:
- 8 (A) Home care workers, as defined in ORS 410.600;
- 9 (B) Direct caregivers employed by an in-home care agency as defined in ORS 443.305;
- 10 (C) Physicians;
- 11 (D) Nurse practitioners;
- 12 (E) Psychiatrists;
- 13 (F) Psychologists;
- 14 (G) Volunteers; or
- 15 (H) Individuals classified as a supervisor under an applicable collective bargaining agree-

- (b) "Home hospice care staff" means individuals who provide home hospice services.
 "Home hospice care staff" does not include:
- 20 (A) Home care workers, as defined in ORS 410.600;

- 22 (C) Physicians;
- 23 (D) Nurse practitioners;
- 24 (E) Psychiatrists;

[(1)] (2) A home health agency providing home health services may not compensate [a nurse]
home health care staff providing home health services for the agency on a per-visit basis.

4 [(2)] (3) A hospice program providing hospice services may not compensate [a nurse] home 5 hospice care staff providing hospice services for the program on a per-visit basis.

6 (4) For purposes of this section, compensation shall be considered to be on a per-visit 7 basis if paid in connection with any term or condition of employment that is directly or in-8 directly related to or based in whole or in part on:

9 (a) The total number of patients served by a home health care staff person or a home 10 hospice care staff person; or

(b) The number of visits made to patients by a home health care staff person or a home
 hospice care staff person.

[(3)(a)] (5)(a) The Bureau of Labor and Industries shall enforce compliance with the provisions
 of this section.

(b) In accordance with the provisions of ORS chapter 183, the Commissioner of the Bureau ofLabor and Industries may adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this section.

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
