SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs OHA to study the standards that must be met to retain a person for treatment when the person objects. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.2).

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study civil commitment criteria. Directs the authority to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary not later than September 15, 2026.

Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

2 Relating to civil commitment.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Oregon Health Authority shall study civil commitment criteria. The 5 authority shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include

6 recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly re-

7 lated to the judiciary no later than September 15, 2026.
