

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 200

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, before the period insert “; creating new provisions; amending ORS  
2 137.300; repealing ORS 1.012 and 21.006; and declaring an emergency”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 8 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The State Court Technology Fund, established under ORS 1.012, is**  
5 **abolished.**

6 **“(2) Any moneys remaining in the State Court Technology Fund on the effective date of**  
7 **this 2025 Act that are unexpended, unobligated and not subject to any conditions shall be**  
8 **transferred to the General Fund to be used for general governmental purposes.**

9 **“SECTION 2. ORS 137.300, as amended by section 58, chapter 70, Oregon Laws 2024, is**  
10 **amended to read:**

11 “137.300. (1) The Criminal Fine Account is established in the General Fund. Except as otherwise  
12 provided by law, all amounts collected in state courts as monetary obligations in criminal actions  
13 shall be deposited by the courts in the account. All moneys in the account are continuously appro-  
14 priated to the Department of Revenue to be distributed by the Department of Revenue as provided  
15 in this section. The Department of Revenue shall keep a record of moneys transferred into and out  
16 of the account.

17 “(2) The Legislative Assembly shall first allocate moneys from the Criminal Fine Account for  
18 the following purposes, in the following order of priority:

19 “(a) Allocations for public safety standards, training and facilities.

20 “(b) Allocations for criminal injuries compensation and assistance to victims of crime and chil-  
21 dren reasonably suspected of being victims of crime.

22 “(c) Allocations for the forensic services provided by the Oregon State Police, including, but not  
23 limited to, services of the Chief Medical Examiner.

24 “(d) Allocations for the maintenance and operation of the Law Enforcement Data System.

25 “(3) After making allocations under subsection (2) of this section, the Legislative Assembly shall  
26 allocate moneys from the Criminal Fine Account for the following purposes:

27 “(a) Allocations to the Law Enforcement Medical Liability Account established under ORS  
28 414.815.

29 “(b) Allocations to the State Court Facilities and Security Account established under ORS 1.178.

30 “(c) Allocations to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of planning, operating and  
31 maintaining county juvenile and adult corrections programs and facilities and drug and alcohol  
32 programs.

33 “(d) Allocations to the Oregon Health Authority for the purpose of grants under ORS 430.345  
34 for the establishment, operation and maintenance of alcohol and drug abuse prevention, early  
35 intervention and treatment services provided through a county.

1 “(e) Allocations to the Oregon State Police for the purpose of the enforcement of the laws re-  
2 lating to driving under the influence of intoxicants.

3 “(f) Allocations to the Arrest and Return Account established under ORS 133.865.

4 “(g) Allocations to the Intoxicated Driver Program Fund established under ORS 813.270.

5 “[*(h) Allocations to the State Court Technology Fund established under ORS 1.012.*]

6 “(4) It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that allocations from the Criminal Fine Account  
7 under subsection (3) of this section be consistent with historical funding of the entities, programs  
8 and accounts listed in subsection (3) of this section from monetary obligations imposed in criminal  
9 proceedings. Amounts that are allocated under subsection (3)(c) of this section shall be distributed  
10 to counties based on the amounts that were transferred to counties by circuit courts during the  
11 2009-2011 biennium under the provisions of ORS 137.308, as in effect January 1, 2011.

12 “(5) Moneys in the Criminal Fine Account may not be allocated for the payment of debt service  
13 obligations.

14 “(6) The Department of Revenue shall deposit in the General Fund all moneys remaining in the  
15 Criminal Fine Account after the distributions listed in subsections (2) and (3) of this section have  
16 been made.

17 “(7) The Department of Revenue shall establish by rule a process for distributing moneys in the  
18 Criminal Fine Account. The department may not distribute more than one-eighth of the total  
19 biennial allocation to an entity during a calendar quarter.

20 “**SECTION 3. ORS 1.012 and 21.006 are repealed.**

21 “**SECTION 4. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
22 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect**  
23 **on its passage.**  
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
