SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act directs OJD to study extreme risk protection orders. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.3).

Requires the Judicial Department to study the number of extreme risk protection petitions filed and orders issued each year. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary not later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to extreme risk protection orders.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. The Judicial Department shall study the number of extreme risk protection petitions filed and orders issued each year. The department shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary no later than September 15, 2026.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.
