

Senate Bill 262

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Judiciary)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells the CJC to do a study. (Flesch Readability Score: 100.0).

Directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study the use of technology in improving the efficiency of pretrial proceedings, and to provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.

Sunsets January 2, 2027.

2 Relating to pretrial proceedings.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall study the use of technol-**
5 **ogy in improving the efficiency of pretrial proceedings.**

6 **(2) The commission shall provide the results of the study, including any recommended**
7 **legislative changes, in a report to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative As-**
8 **sembly in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 no later than December 31, 2026.**

9 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.**
