SUMMARY

Digest: Tells ODE to take actions, and to develop a common coding system, for student absences. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.8).

[Digest: Tells ODE to take actions about how school districts record and respond to student absences. (Flesch Readability Score: 67.5).]

Directs the Department of Education to review, [and] make recommendations and develop best practices related to the recording of student absences and how school districts respond to student absences and to develop a common coding system for school districts to use for student absences.

[Requires school districts to report to the department when a student is not considered to have regular attendance.]

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2	Relating to the recording of student absences.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall:
5	(a) Review, make recommendations and develop best practices related to:
6	(A) The recording of student absences by school districts; and
7	(B) School district responses to student absences that exceed 10 days.
8	(b) Develop a common coding system for school districts to record and report student
9	absences for the purposes of ORS 339.065, with consideration of the size and geographic lo-
10	cation of a school district.
11	(2)(a) Not later than May 31, 2026, the department shall provide a report to:
12	(A) The interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to education; and
13	(B) The State Board of Education.
14	(b) The report required under paragraph (a) of this subsection shall:
15	(A) Summarize the review conducted, the recommendations made and the best practices
16	developed as described in subsection (1)(a) of this section;
17	(B) Summarize the common coding system developed as provided by subsection (1)(b) of
18	this section; and
19	(C) Recommend any changes in administrative rules and legislation, including identifying
20	any funding needed for implementation.
21	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.
