

A-Engrossed Senate Bill 32

Ordered by the Senate March 28
Including Senate Amendments dated March 28

Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: This Act makes OHCS post data on low-income public housing on its webpage. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.9).

[Digest: The Act tells OHCS to study housing. (Flesch Readability Score: 90.9).]

[Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to study housing. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to housing not later than September 15, 2026.]

Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to post information about publicly supported housing on the department's webpage.

Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to housing; and prescribing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 456.255 to 456.267.

SECTION 2. The Housing and Community Services Department shall maintain on the department's website information in the department's possession with respect to publicly supported housing, including information on:

- (1) The expiration dates of the affordability restrictions;**
- (2) The number of housing units;**
- (3) The type and source of rental assistance;**
- (4) Income eligibility levels; and**
- (5) The current status of preservation efforts, if any.**

SECTION 3. This 2025 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2025 regular session of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.
