Senate Bill 367

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act stops the state from closing businesses when a state officer declares an emergency. The Act starts when the Act is signed. (Flesch Readability Score: 73.7).

Prohibits the Governor or a state officer or agency from requiring a lawful ongoing business concern to close or suspend operations during a declared state of emergency or a declared state of public health emergency.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to prohibitions on business closures mandated by the executive branch; and declaring an 3 emergency. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 401.165 to 5 401.236. 6 SECTION 2. The Governor, and any state officer or agency in the executive branch, may 7 not order any ongoing business concern to close or suspend operations under the authority 8 of the other provisions of ORS 401.165 to 401.236, if the business concern was operating law-9 10 fully immediately prior to the declaration of a state of emergency under ORS 401.165. SECTION 3. Section 4 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 433.441 to 11 433.452. 12 SECTION 4. The Governor, and any state officer or agency in the executive branch, may 13not order any ongoing business concern to close or suspend operations under the authority 14 of the other provisions of ORS 433.441 to 433.452, if the business concern was operating law-15fully immediately prior to the declaration of a state of public health emergency under ORS 16 433.441. 17 SECTION 5. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 18 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect 19 20on its passage. 21
