

A-Engrossed Senate Bill 5514

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act creates an agency budget. (Flesch Readability Score: 73.8).

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Department of Early Learning and Care for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the department.

Limits biennial expenditures by the department from federal funds.

Limits biennial expenditures by the department for payment of operations, grants-in-aid, program costs and purchased services from certain fees, moneys or other revenues collected or received by the department.

Declares an emergency, effective July 1, 2025.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the Department of Early Learning and Care; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Department of Early Learning and Care, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the following purposes:

(1) Operations..... \$ 71,472,929

(2) Early learning programs..... \$668,879,857

SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Early Learning and Care, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$652,707, for deposit into the Tribal Early Learning Fund established by section 3, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2025 (Enrolled House Bill 2815).

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, corporate activity tax funds transferred from the Early Learning Account by the Department of Education and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Early Learning and Care, for the following purposes:

(1) Operations..... \$ 7,558,728

(2) Early learning programs..... \$ 13,442,253

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts

are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Department of Early Learning and Care, for the following purposes:

(1) Operations..... \$ 57,030,987

(2) Early learning programs..... \$189,975,785

SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses for operations, grants-in-aid, program costs and purchased services by the Department of Early Learning and Care from corporate activity tax funds transferred from the Early Learning Account by the Department of Education, for the following purposes:

(1) Operations..... \$ 7,250,539

(2) Early learning programs..... \$433,296,509

SECTION 6. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect July 1, 2025.
