SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act creates an agency budget. (Flesch Readability Score: 73.8).

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Department of Education for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures by the department from lottery moneys.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from certain fees, moneys or other revenues collected or received by the department.

Limits biennial expenditures by the department from certain federal funds. Limits biennial expenditures and transfers by the department from specified accounts.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares an emergency, effective July 1, 2025.
