

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5525

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 24 and delete pages 2 through 4 and insert:
“**SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the following purposes:**

- (1) **Higher Education Coordinating Commission programs and operations \$ 96,610,434**
- (2) **Public university operations and student support for distribution to public universities..... \$ 1,068,825,130**
- (3) **Community College Support Fund for distribution to community colleges and community college service districts and school districts..... \$ 858,973,475**
- (4) **Oregon Opportunity Grant ... \$ 231,671,200**

24 “**SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
 25 \$35,479,189 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for
 26 payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-
 27 nomic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service
 28 on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon public universities.

29 “**SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
 30 \$11,683,799 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for
 31 payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-
 32 nomic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service
 33 on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon community colleges.

34 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
 35 \$48,060,583 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for
 36 payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-
 37 nomic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to the Outdoor
 38 School Education Fund.

39 “**SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
 40 \$18,852,926 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for
 41 payment of expenses by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from lottery moneys
 42 allocated to the Sports Lottery Account.

43 “**SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
 44 \$94,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for
 45 payment of expenses from lottery moneys distributed from the Education Stability Fund to

the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon Opportunity Grants.

“SECTION 7. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$11,090,554, to award grants to Portland State University and Oregon’s technical regional universities (Oregon Institute of Technology, Southern Oregon University, Eastern Oregon University and Western Oregon University) to assist these institutions with long-term financial sustainability and for the commission to support direct admissions work in collaboration with the universities.

“SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds and funds described in sections 12 to 16 of this 2025 Act, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the following purposes:

- (1) Higher Education Coordinating Commission programs and related grants \$ 106,412,317
- (2) Debt service on outstanding lottery bonds and general obligation bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon public universities \$ 3,803,366

“SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$5,438,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the commission for carrying out the provisions of ORS 660.380 and 660.385.

“SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$71,562,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the commission for carrying out the provisions of ORS 660.400 and 660.405.

“SECTION 11. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$145,801,717 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 14 of this 2025 Act, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for Higher Education Coordinating Commission programs and related grants.

“SECTION 12. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$105,333 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from the moneys received from the Western Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund and the Eastern Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund for the Community College Support Fund.

“SECTION 13. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, expenditures by the Higher Edu-

1 cation Coordinating Commission for debt service on general obligation bonds issued for the
2 benefit of public universities and Oregon Health and Science University and paid with re-
3 sources received from the public universities and Oregon Health and Science University are
4 not limited.

5 “SECTION 14. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, expenditures by the Higher Edu-
6 cation Coordinating Commission for payments to individuals, organizations or units of gov-
7 ernment from federal National Emergency Grants funds are not limited.

8 “SECTION 15. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, expenditures by the Higher Edu-
9 cation Coordinating Commission for debt service on Build America Bonds sold for the benefit
10 of public universities and community colleges are not limited.

11 “SECTION 16. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, expenditures by the Higher Edu-
12 cation Coordinating Commission of moneys from the Tuition Protection Fund are not limited.

13 “SECTION 17. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
14 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect
15 July 1, 2025.”.
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
