

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5547

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 Delete lines 4 through 15 of the printed bill and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
3 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023,
4 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by
5 \$6,315,525, for a budget realignment.

6 “**SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
7 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
8 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
9 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
10 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
11 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
12 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
13 ment of Human Services, for self-sufficiency programs, is decreased by \$29,940, for a budget
14 realignment.

15 “**SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
16 expenditures established by section 3 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
17 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
18 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
19 received by the Department of Human Services, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased
20 by \$11,525,734, for a budget realignment.

21 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
22 expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
23 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
24 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
25 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
26 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
27 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
28 ment of Human Services, for vocational rehabilitation services, is increased by \$3,578,531, for
29 a budget realignment.

30 “**SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
31 expenditures established by section 3 (4), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
32 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
33 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
34 received by the Department of Human Services, for vocational rehabilitation services, is in-
35 creased by \$3,723,407, for a budget realignment.

1 **SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
2 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023,
3 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for child welfare programs, is decreased by \$25,904,346,
4 for a budget realignment.

5 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
6 expenditures established by section 3 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
7 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
8 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
9 received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare programs, is decreased by
10 \$6,559,807, for a budget realignment.

11 **SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
12 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023,
13 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for aging and people with disabilities programs, is in-
14 creased by \$255,050, for a budget realignment.

15 **SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
16 expenditures established by section 2 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
17 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
18 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
19 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
20 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
21 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
22 ment of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities programs, is increased by
23 \$18,267,892, for a budget realignment.

24 **SECTION 10.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
25 expenditures established by section 2 (11), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
26 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
27 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
28 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
29 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
30 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
31 ment of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities - ARPA State Fiscal Recovery
32 Fund moneys for long term care workforce development and emergency preparedness, is
33 decreased by \$7,183,767, for a budget realignment.

34 **SECTION 11.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
35 expenditures established by section 3 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
36 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
37 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
38 received by the Department of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities pro-
39 grams, is increased by \$64,406,239, for a budget realignment.

40 **SECTION 12.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
41 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (7), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
42 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for intellectual/developmental disabilities pro-
43 grams, is increased by \$6,791,006, for a budget realignment.

44 **SECTION 13.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
45 expenditures established by section 3 (7), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium

1 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
2 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
3 received by the Department of Human Services, for intellectual/developmental disabilities
4 programs, is increased by \$17,645,569, for a budget realignment.

5 “SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
6 expenditures established by section 2 (9), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
7 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
8 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
9 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
10 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
11 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
12 ment of Human Services, for Oregon Eligibility Partnership, is increased by \$2,760,408, for a
13 budget realignment.

14 “SECTION 15. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
15 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
16 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for central services, is increased by \$500,000, for
17 case management and other assistance to flood survivors in Coos, Douglas and Harney
18 counties.

19 “SECTION 16. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
20 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (1), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
21 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for Health Systems Division -Administration, is in-
22 creased by \$8,897,197, for a budget realignment.

23 “SECTION 17. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
24 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (2), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
25 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for Health Systems Division - Programs, is decreased
26 by \$103,222,213, for a budget realignment.

27 “SECTION 18. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
28 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 12, chapter 71, Oregon Laws 2024, for
29 the biennium ending June 30, 2025, to provide the nonfederal matching share required for
30 costs of targeted case management services in the Nurse-Family Partnership nurse home
31 visiting services program, is decreased by \$1,455,147, for a budget realignment.

32 “SECTION 19. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
33 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (3), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
34 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for health policy and analytics, is increased by
35 \$12,068,749, for a budget realignment.

36 “SECTION 20. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
37 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 305, chapter 605, Oregon Laws 2023,
38 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, to provide reimbursements under section 3, chapter
39 441, Oregon Laws 2023, is decreased by \$3,000,000, for a budget realignment.

40 “SECTION 21. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
41 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (4), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
42 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for public health, is increased by \$13,983,397, for a
43 budget realignment.

44 “SECTION 22. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
45 ation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (5), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,

1 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for Oregon State Hospital, is increased by \$20,274,996,
2 for a budget realignment.

3 **“SECTION 23.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
4 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
5 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
6 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, marijuana tax re-
7 cepts, beer and wine tax receipts, provider taxes and Medicare receipts, but excluding lot-
8 tery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
9 collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems Division - Admin-
10 istration, is increased by \$5,845,103, for a budget realignment.

11 **“SECTION 24.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
12 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
13 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
14 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, marijuana tax re-
15 cepts, beer and wine tax receipts, provider taxes and Medicare receipts, but excluding lot-
16 tery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
17 collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems Division - Pro-
18 grams, is decreased by \$19,732,258, for a budget realignment.

19 **“SECTION 25.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
20 expenditures established by section 2 (5), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
21 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
22 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, marijuana tax re-
23 cepts, beer and wine tax receipts, provider taxes and Medicare receipts, but excluding lot-
24 tery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
25 collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for public health, is decreased by
26 \$807,608, for a budget realignment.

27 **“SECTION 26.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
28 expenditures established by section 2 (7), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
29 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
30 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, marijuana tax re-
31 cepts, beer and wine tax receipts, provider taxes and Medicare receipts, but excluding lot-
32 tery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023,
33 collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Oregon State Hospital, is increased
34 by \$48,136,743, for a budget realignment.

35 **“SECTION 27.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
36 expenditures established by section 5 (1), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
37 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds,
38 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
39 received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems Division - Administration, is
40 increased by \$11,876,621, for a budget realignment.

41 **“SECTION 28.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
42 expenditures established by section 5 (2), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
43 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds,
44 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
45 received by the Oregon Health Authority, Health Systems Division - Programs, is increased

1 by \$305,985,650, for a budget realignment.

2 “SECTION 29. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
3 expenditures established by section 5 (5), chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
4 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds,
5 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
6 received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Oregon State Hospital, is increased by
7 \$3,421,054, for a budget realignment.

8 “SECTION 30. This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
9 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect
10 on its passage.”.
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
