

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5550

5 **“SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation**
6 **made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (2), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023,**
7 **for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is**
8 **increased by \$11,625,863, for a budget realignment.**

9 **“SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
10 **expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium**
11 **ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or**
12 **other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal**
13 **funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries**
14 **and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not**
15 **described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-**
16 **ment of Human Services, for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by**
17 **\$601,603, for a budget realignment.**

18 **“SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
19 **expenditures established by section 3 (2), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium**
20 **ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,**
21 **excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or**
22 **received by the Department of Human Services, for state assessments and enterprise-wide**
23 **costs, is increased by \$3,621,420, for a budget realignment.**

24 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation**
25 **made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023,**
26 **for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by**
27 **\$5,369,793, for a budget realignment.**

28 **“SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
29 **expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium**
30 **ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or**
31 **other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal**
32 **funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries**
33 **and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not**
34 **described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-**
35 **ment of Human Services, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by \$10,189,756, for a**

1 budget realignment.

2 “SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
3 expenditures established by section 3 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
4 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
5 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
6 received by the Department of Human Services, for self-sufficiency programs, is decreased
7 by \$4,280,647, for a budget realignment.

8 “SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
9 expenditures established by section 3 (4), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
10 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
11 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
12 received by the Department of Human Services, for vocational rehabilitation services, is in-
13 creased by \$2,299,564, for a budget realignment.

14 “SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
15 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023,
16 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for child welfare programs, is decreased by \$521,132,
17 for a budget realignment.

18 “SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
19 expenditures established by section 3 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
20 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
21 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
22 received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare programs, is decreased by
23 \$4,787,712, for a budget realignment.

24 “SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
25 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
26 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for aging and people with disabilities programs,
27 is increased by \$109,646,891, for a budget realignment.

28 “SECTION 11. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
29 expenditures established by section 2 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
30 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
31 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
32 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
33 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
34 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
35 ment of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities programs, is increased by
36 \$24,365,766, for a budget realignment.

37 “SECTION 12. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
38 expenditures established by section 3 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
39 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
40 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
41 received by the Department of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities pro-
42 grams, is increased by \$218,953,855, for a budget realignment.

43 “SECTION 13. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
44 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (7), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
45 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for intellectual/developmental disabilities pro-

1 grams, is increased by \$35,234,037, for a budget realignment.

2 “SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
3 expenditures established by section 3 (7), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
4 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
5 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
6 received by the Department of Human Services, for intellectual/developmental disabilities
7 programs, is increased by \$155,598,103, for a budget realignment.

8 “SECTION 15. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
9 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
10 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for central services, is increased by \$276,290, for
11 increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

12 “SECTION 16. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
13 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
14 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
15 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
16 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
17 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
18 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
19 ment of Human Services, for central services, is increased by \$8,204, for increased personal
20 services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

21 “SECTION 17. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
22 expenditures established by section 3 (1), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
23 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
24 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
25 received by the Department of Human Services, for central services, is increased by \$188,188,
26 for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

27 “SECTION 18. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
28 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (2), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
29 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs,
30 is increased by \$786,320, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjust-
31 ments.

32 “SECTION 19. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
33 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
34 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
35 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
36 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
37 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
38 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
39 ment of Human Services, for state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by
40 \$69,775, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

41 “SECTION 20. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on

43 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
44 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
45 received by the Department of Human Services, for state assessments and enterprise-wide

1 costs, is increased by \$570,758, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity
2 adjustments.

3 **“SECTION 21.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
4 expenditures established by section 2 (8), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
5 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
6 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
7 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
8 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
9 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
10 ment of Human Services, for shared services, is increased by \$1,426,853, for increased per-
11 sonal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

12 **“SECTION 22.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
13 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
14 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by
15 \$1,746,972, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

16 **“SECTION 23.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
17 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
18 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
19 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
20 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
21 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
22 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
23 ment of Human Services, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by \$874, for increased
24 personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

39 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
40 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
41 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
42 ment of Human Services, for vocational rehabilitation services, is increased by \$2,408, for
43 increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

7 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for child welfare programs, is increased by
8 \$5,687,511, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

9 “SECTION 29. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
10 expenditures established by section 3 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
11 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
12 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
13 received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare programs, is increased by
14 \$2,232,035, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

15 “SECTION 30. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
16 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
17 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for aging and people with disabilities programs,
18 is increased by \$1,956,098, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjust-
19 ments.

20 “SECTION 31. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
21 expenditures established by section 2 (6), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
22 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
23 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
24 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
25 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
26 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
27 ment of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities programs, is increased by
28 \$21,382, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

29 “SECTION 32. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on

31 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
32 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
33 received by the Department of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities pro-
34 grams, is increased by \$1,788,602, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity
35 adjustments.

36 “SECTION 33. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
37 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (7), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
38 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for intellectual/developmental disabilities pro-
39 grams, is increased by \$1,292,970, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity
40 adjustments.

41 “SECTION 34. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
42 expenditures established by section 3 (7), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
43 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
44 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
45 received by the Department of Human Services, for intellectual/developmental disabilities

1 programs, is increased by \$2,254,035, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity
2 adjustments.

3 **“SECTION 35.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
4 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (8), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
5 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for Oregon Eligibility Partnership, is increased
6 by \$6,685,528, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

7 **“SECTION 36.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
8 expenditures established by section 2 (8), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
9 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
10 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
11 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
12 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
13 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
14 ment of Human Services, for Oregon Eligibility Partnership, is increased by \$5,663, for in-
15 creased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

16 **“SECTION 37.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
17 expenditures established by section 3 (8), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
18 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
19 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
20 received by the Department of Human Services, for Oregon Eligibility Partnership, is in-
21 creased by \$5,090,753, for increased personal services costs related to pay equity adjustments.

22 **“SECTION 38.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
23 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
24 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for child welfare programs, is increased by
25 \$1,384,605, for position compensation adjustments.

26 **“SECTION 39.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
27 expenditures established by section 3 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
28 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
29 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or
30 received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare programs, is increased by
31 \$620,037, for position compensation adjustments.

32 **“SECTION 40.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
33 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (5), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
34 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for child welfare programs, is increased by
35 \$10,000,000, for temporary lodging prevention.

36 **“SECTION 41.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
37 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
38 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
39 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
40 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
41 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
42 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
43 ment of Human Services, for central services, is increased by \$3,200,000, for emergency
44 stockpile distribution.

45 **“SECTION 42.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-

1 ation made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 610, Oregon Laws
2 2023, for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for central services, is increased by \$534,673, for
3 wildfire costs associated with the 2024 fire season.

4 “SECTION 43. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
5 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
6 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
7 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal
8 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries
9 and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
10 described in section 2, chapter 610, Oregon Laws 2023, collected or received by the Depart-
11 ment of Human Services, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by \$15,000,000, for
12 employment-related day care payments.

13 “SECTION 44. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
14 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (1), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023,
15 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for operations and health services, is decreased by
16 \$19,031,039, for a budget realignment.

17 “SECTION 45. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
18 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (2), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023,
19 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for central administration and administrative services,
20 is increased by \$12,495,644, for a budget realignment.

21 “SECTION 46. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
22 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (3), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023,
23 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for correctional services, is increased by \$7,385,395,
24 for a budget realignment.

25 “SECTION 47. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
26 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (4), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023,
27 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for community corrections, is decreased by \$600,000,
28 for a budget realignment.

29 “SECTION 48. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
30 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (6), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023,
31 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for capital improvements, is decreased by \$250,000, for
32 a budget realignment.

33 “SECTION 49. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
34 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
35 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
36 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
37 funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for operations and health
38 services, is increased by \$500,000, for a residential substance abuse treatment grant.

39 “SECTION 50. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
40 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
41 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
42 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
43 funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for operations and health
44 services, is increased by \$390,802, for the electronic health record project.

45 “SECTION 51. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on

1 expenditures established by section 10, chapter 605, Oregon Laws 2023, for the biennium
2 ending June 30, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of
3 Corrections from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund mon-
4 eys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the
5 Department of Corrections, for operations and health services, is increased by \$105,402, for
6 the electronic health record project.

7 “SECTION 52. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
8 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (4), chapter 377, Oregon Laws 2023,
9 for the biennium ending June 30, 2025, for community corrections, is increased by \$2,297,691,
10 for the reimbursement to counties for the costs of incarcerated persons sentenced under
11 felony driving under the influence of intoxicants.

12 “SECTION 53. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
