SUMMARY

Requires the state medical assistance program and health insurance policies and certificates to cover computerized tomography coronary calcium score scans for individuals 40 years of age or older.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 414.
5	SECTION 2. The health services to be provided in medical assistance under ORS 414.065
6	must include computerized tomography coronary calcium score scans with or without con-
7	trast for individuals 40 years of age or older, when prescribed by a licensed or certified health
8	professional.
9	SECTION 3. Section 4 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of the Insurance Code.
10	SECTION 4. (1) A policy or certificate of health insurance offered in this state that re-
11	imburses the cost of laboratory services must reimburse the cost of computerized
12	tomography coronary calcium score scans with or without contrast for individuals 40 years
13	of age or older, when prescribed by a licensed or certified health professional.
14	(2) This section is exempt from ORS 743A.001.
15	SECTION 5. Section 4 of this 2025 Act applies to policies and certificates of health in-
16	surance issued, renewed or extended on or after January 1, 2026.

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
