SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells SPRD to conduct a study about state parks and to submit a report to the state legislature. The Act makes DAS in charge of the management and control of the grounds in the capitol area. (Flesch Readability Score: 67.3).

[Digest: The Act tells the State Parks and Recreation Department to study state campgrounds near the Oregon coast. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.1).]

[Requires the State Parks and Recreation Department to study existing, expanding and establishing state campgrounds within 25 miles of the Oregon coast. Directs the department to report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to state parks no later September 15, 2026.] Transfers the management and control of the grounds in the capitol area from the State Parks and Recreation Department to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

Directs the State Parks and Recreation Department to conduct a study on state parks and to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to state parks no later than September 15, 2026.

Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

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7	STATE PARK STUDY
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9	SECTION 1. (1) The State Parks and Recreation Department shall study:
10	(a) Options to establish a sustainable funding model to address revenue shortfalls from
11	current state park operations.
12	(b) The feasibility of operating the state parks system in a manner that generates suffi-
13	cient revenue to cover the expenses of operating the state parks system.
14	(c) Aspects of department operations or programming that generate disproportionate
15	funding or revenue or that may be better suited for a different organizational structure.
16	(d) Statutory or regulatory barriers to addressing the unique needs of the state parks
17	system.
18	(e) The feasibility of expanding state campgrounds in high demand areas, including within
19	25 miles of the Oregon coast.
20	(f) The feasibility of addressing maintenance or repair needs of the aging infrastructure
21	in the state parks system for future generations.

1	(g) Options to establish revenue sources to provide sustainable funding to meet the rec-
2	reational needs of Oregonians while protecting and preserving Oregon's natural environment
3	for future generations.
4	(2) The department shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and
5	may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative
6	Assembly related to state parks no later than September 15, 2026.
7	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2025 Act is repealed on January 2, 2027.
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9	MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF CAPITOL AREA
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11	SECTION 3. ORS 276.003 is amended to read:
12	276.003. (1) There is created in the General Fund of the State Treasury a State Capitol Operat-
13	ing Account. Moneys credited to the account are appropriated continuously to the Legislative Ad-
14	ministration Committee to pay the expenses of operating, maintaining, protecting and insuring the
15	State Capitol and to reimburse the [State Parks and Recreation Department] Oregon Department
16	of Administrative Services for a share of the expenses of ground maintenance, utilities and other
17	necessary expenses.
18	(2) The Legislative Administration Committee may on behalf of the State of Oregon solicit and
19	accept gifts, grants and donations from public and private sources for the purposes set out in ORS
20	276.002. Such gifts, grants and donations shall be deposited by the committee in separate, appropri-
21	ate trust accounts until such time as required to meet the obligations for which the gifts, grants or
22	donations were intended.
23	(3) A gift or donation to the Legislative Administration Committee is a gift or donation to the
24	State of Oregon.
25	SECTION 4. ORS 276.004 is amended to read:
26	276.004. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and except for the Supreme Court
27	Building[,] and the State Capitol [and the grounds included within the State Capitol State Park under
28	ORS 276.053 (1) to (5)], the Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall manage and control
29	the utilization of:
30	(a) Buildings, grounds and properties in the capitol area, as defined in ORS 276.010, including
31	those acquired under ORS 276.046;
32	(b) Office buildings as defined in ORS 276.110;
33	(c) Vacated state institution buildings and facilities as described in ORS 276.180;
34	(d) The state office building and parking structure in Portland;
35	(e) The state office building and parking structure in Eugene;
36	(f) Properties being acquired through lease-purchase option or installment purchase agreement

(a) The capitol group of buildings and the grounds owned by the state adjacent to the buildings,
and includes any new buildings that may be constructed on the grounds as an addition to the capitol
group of buildings.

7 (b) The grounds immediately surrounding the State Capitol bordered by State Street on 8 the south, Court Street on the north, Cottage Street on the west and Waverly Street on the 9 east.

10 (2) "Capitol group of buildings" means the state buildings in Salem in and about the Capitol 11 Mall, other than the State Capitol [and the grounds included within the State Capitol State Park 12 under ORS 276.053 (1) to (5)].

[(4)] (2) The [Oregon Department of Administrative Services] department shall construct one or more permanent lavatories on the grounds of the [State Capitol State Park] capitol area. Upon completion of construction, the [State Parks and Recreation Department] department shall maintain and control the utilization of the lavatories.

39 [(5)(a)] (3)(a) To commemorate and honor Indian tribes, the [State Parks and Recreation De-40 partment] department shall plan, erect and maintain one or more monuments or other suitable 41 markers that are sited within, and are compatible with, the Walk of the Flags on the grounds of the 42 State Capitol [State Park].

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18	SECTION 11. The duties, functions and powers of the State Parks and Recreation De-
19	partment relating to the capitol area, as defined in ORS 276.010, are imposed upon, trans-
20	ferred to and vested in the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.
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22	RECORDS, PROPERTY, EMPLOYEES
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24	SECTION 12. (1) The State Parks and Recreation Director shall:
25	(a) Deliver to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services all records and property
26	within the jurisdiction of the director that relate to the duties, functions and powers trans-
27	ferred by section 11 of this 2025 Act; and
28	(b) Transfer to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services those employees en-
29	gaged primarily in the exercise of the duties, functions and powers transferred by section

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40	ACTION, PROCEEDING, PROSECUTION
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42	SECTION 13. The transfer of duties, functions and powers to the Oregon Department of
43	Administrative Services by section 11 of this 2025 Act does not affect any action, proceeding
44	or prosecution involving or with respect to the duties, functions and powers begun before
45	and pending at the time of the transfer, except that the Oregon Department of Administra-

1	tive Services is substituted for the State Parks and Recreation Department in the action,
2	proceeding or prosecution.
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4	LIABILITY, DUTY, OBLIGATION
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6	SECTION 14. (1) Nothing in sections 11 to 13 of this 2025 Act and the amendments to ORS
7	276.003, 276.004, 276.010, 276.053, 276.058, 390.111 and 390.997 and section 2, chapter 485, Oregon
8	Laws 2021, by sections 3 to 10 of this 2025 Act relieves a person of a liability, duty or obli-
9	gation accruing under or with respect to the duties, functions and powers transferred by
10	section 11 of this 2025 Act. The Oregon Department of Administrative Services may under-
11	take the collection or enforcement of any such liability, duty or obligation.
12	(2) The rights and obligations of the State Parks and Recreation Department legally in-
13	curred under contracts, leases and business transactions executed, entered into or begun
14	before the operative date specified in section 15 of this 2025 Act accruing under or with re-
15	spect to the duties, functions and powers transferred by section 11 of this 2025 Act are
16	transferred to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services. For the purpose of suc-
17	cession to these rights and obligations, the Oregon Department of Administrative Services
18	is a continuation of the State Parks and Recreation Department and not a new authority.

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22	SECTION 15. Section 10 of this 2025 Act and the amendments to ORS 276.003, 276.004,
23	276.010, 276.053, 276.058, 390.111 and 390.997 and section 2, chapter 485, Oregon Laws 2021, by
24	sections 3 to 10 of this 2025 Act become operative on January 1, 2026.

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28	SECTION 16. The Oregon Department of Administrative Services may take any action
29	before the operative date specified in section 14 of this 2025 Act that is necessary for the
30	department to exercise, on or after the operative date specified in section 15 of this 2025 Act,
31	all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the department by section 11 of this 2025
32	Act and the amendments to ORS 276.003, 276.004, 276.010, 276.053, 276.058, 390.111 and 390.997
