Senate Bill 644

Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act tells a legislative group to audit the state food bank for political spending. The Act ends at the start of 2027. The Act starts when signed. (Flesch Readability Score: 76.5).

Establishes the Oregon Food Bank Audit Committee as a joint committee of the Legislative Assembly. Directs the committee to cause an audit to be performed of Oregon Food Bank financial transactions occurring during a specified period, and to identify those transactions that directly or indirectly relate to political campaign activity or political issue activity. Directs the committee to report on audit findings to the Legislative Assembly on or before November 15, 2025. Requires the membership of the committee to consist of an equal number of majority party and

minority party members from the Senate and an equal number of majority party and minority party members from the House of Representatives. Provides that a quorum of the committee consists of a majority of members from the House and a majority of members from the Senate.

Sunsets January 2, 2027.

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Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to auditing the Oregon Food Bank; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Food Bank Audit Committee is established as a joint com-4 mittee of the Legislative Assembly. 5

6 (2) The committee shall cause an audit of the Oregon Food Bank to be performed that 7 is to examine all financial transactions conducted or engaged in by the Oregon Food Bank, 8 a subsidiary or subdivision of the Oregon Food Bank or a person acting on behalf of or at 9 the direction of the Oregon Food Bank. The audit is to examine all financial transactions occurring during the period beginning on December 1, 2021, and ending on January 1, 2025. 10 11 Persons conducting the audit shall identify and report to the committee on all financial 12 transactions that are directly or indirectly related to political campaign activity or political issue activity. 13

(3) The committee may arrange for one or more persons with expertise and experience 14 15 performing financial audits to perform the audit described in subsection (2) of this section. To facilitate performance of the audit, the contracted auditors may request the committee 16 17 to exercise its authority to compel the production of records under ORS 171.510.

18 (4) The contracted auditors shall report findings to the committee at the dates and times 19 prescribed by the committee. The committee shall prepare a written report to the Legislative 20 Assembly of the results of the audit on or before November 15, 2025.

21(5) At the direction of the committee, the Legislative Administrator shall execute those 22contracts and agreements necessary for persons selected by the committee under subsection 23

- (3) of this section to perform the auditing functions described in this section.
- 24SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Food Bank Audit Committee established in section 1 of this

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1 2025 Act shall consist of:

(a) Those members of the Senate who are appointed by the President of the Senate so
that there is an equal number of majority party and minority party members of the Senate;
and

5 (b) Those members of the House of Representatives who are appointed by the Speaker 6 of the House so that there is an equal number of majority party and minority party members 7 of the House.

8 (2) The appointing authorities shall appoint members of a new committee within 30 days
9 after the effective date of this 2025 Act.

(3) Vacancies occurring in the membership of the committee shall be filled by the appointing authority so as to ensure an equal number of majority party and minority party
 members from the appropriate house.

(4) The committee may not transact business unless a quorum is present. A quorum
 consists of a majority of committee members from the House of Representatives and a ma jority of committee members from the Senate.

(5) Action by the committee requires the affirmative vote of a majority of committee
 members from the House of Representatives and a majority of committee members from the
 Senate.

(6) The committee has a continuing existence and may meet, act and conduct its business during the sessions of the Legislative Assembly or any recess thereof, and in the interim period between sessions, but the committee has no authority to affect the rules of either house.

23 SECTION 3. Sections 1 and 2 of this 2025 Act are repealed on January 2, 2027.

24 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2025 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 25 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2025 Act takes effect 26 on its passage.

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
