## **A-Engrossed** Senate Bill 837

Ordered by the Senate May 15 Including Senate Amendments dated May 15

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## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act changes the health care volunteer registry known as SERV-OR. The Act allows more types of people to join and allows for the use of volunteers outside of a declared emergency. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.6).

Modifies laws governing the emergency health care provider registry to allow a broader range of volunteer services and allow deployment of volunteers outside of declared emergencies.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to provide workers' compensation coverage for volunteers who provide services in other states pursuant to certain interstate agreements.

5	SECTION 1. ORS 401.651 is amended to read:
6	401.651. As used in ORS 401.651 to 401.670:
7	(1) "Health care facility" means a health care facility as defined in ORS 442.015 that has been

4 (b) Criminal background checks for applicants and persons who have been registered[.]; and

5 (c) Screenings of physical health, emotional health or immunization status in order to 6 assign appropriate duties without increased health-related risks.

(2) The authority [shall] may issue identification cards to [health care providers] individuals

401.657. (1) The Oregon Health Authority may designate all or part of a health care facility or other location as an emergency health care center. If the Governor declares a state of emergency under ORS 401.165, or declares a state of public health emergency under ORS 433.441, emergency health care centers may be used for:

32 (a) Evaluation and referral of individuals affected by the emergency;

33 (b) Provision of health care services; and

34 (c) Preparation of patients for transportation.

(2) The Oregon Health Authority may enter into cooperative agreements with a local public
 health authority, as defined in ORS 431.003, that allow the local public health authority to designate
 emergency health care centers under this section.

(3) An emergency health care center designated under this section must have an emergency
operations plan and a credentialing plan that governs the use of [emergency health care providers]

(1) The Oregon Health Authority shall provide workers' compensation coverage for 8 [volunteer emergency health care providers] individuals registered under ORS 401.654 who are in-9 jured in the course and scope of performing [emergency health care] volunteer services if the injury 10 occurs:

(a) While the [volunteer] individual is performing [health care] services at the direction of the
 authority under ORS 401.661; [or]

(b) While the [volunteer] individual is engaged in training being conducted or approved by the
authority for the purpose of preparing the [volunteer] individual to perform [emergency health care]
services[.]; or

(c) While the individual is performing services at the direction of the authority, pursuant
 to the Emergency Management Assistance Compact and the Pacific Northwest Emergency
 Management Arrangement, in another jurisdiction where such services are required by rea son of an emergency in that jurisdiction.

(2) Workers' compensation coverage shall be provided under this section in the manner provided

22 SECTION 9. ORS 431A.015 is amended to read:

431A.015. (1) Unless the Governor has declared a public health emergency under ORS 433.441,
the Public Health Director may, upon approval of the Governor or the designee of the Governor,
take the public health actions described in subsection (2) of this section if the Public Health Director determines that:

(a)(A) A communicable disease, reportable disease, disease outbreak, epidemic or other condition
 of public health importance has affected more than one county;

(B) There is an immediate need for a consistent response from the state in order to adequately
 protect the public health;

31 (C) The resources of the local public health authority or authorities are likely to be quickly 32 overwhelmed or unable to effectively manage the required response; and

33 (D) There is a significant risk to the public health; or

(b) A communicable disease, reportable disease, disease outbreak, epidemic or other condition
 of public health importance is reported in Oregon and is an issue of significant regional or national
 concern or is an issue for which there is significant involvement from federal authorities requiring
 state-federal coordination.

(2) The Public Health Director, after making the determinations required under subsection (1)
 of this section, may take the following public health actions:

(g) Organize public information activities regarding the public health response to circumstances

(h) Adopt reporting requirements for, and provide notice of those reporting requirements to,
health care providers, institutions and facilities for the purpose of obtaining information directly
related to the public health threat presented.

(i) Take control of antitoxins, serums, vaccines, immunizing agents, antibiotics, antidotes and
 other pharmaceutical agents, medical supplies or personal protective equipment.

(j) Direct and deploy [emergency health care providers] volunteers under ORS 401.661.

(3) The authority granted to the Public Health Director under this section is not intended to
 override the general authority provided to a local public health authority except as already per mitted by law, or under the circumstances described in subsection (1) of this section.

(4) If the Oregon Health Authority adopts temporary rules to implement subsection (2) of this
section, the rules adopted are not subject to the provisions of ORS 183.335 (6)(a). The authority may
amend the temporary rules adopted under this subsection as often as is necessary to respond to the
public health threat.

(5) If it is necessary for the authority to purchase antitoxins, serums, vaccines, immunizing
 agents, antibiotics, antidotes or other pharmaceutical agents, medical supplies or personal protective
 equipment, the purchases are not subject to the provisions of ORS chapter 279A, 279B or 279C.

(6) If property is taken under the authority granted to the Public Health Director under sub section (2) of this section, the owner of the property is entitled to reasonable compensation from the
 state.

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
