On page 5 of the printed bill, delete lines 35 through 45. 1 2 On page 6, delete lines 1 through 40 and insert: "SECTION 8. ORS 476.680 is amended to read: 3 "476.680. (1) There is created the Governor's Fire Service Policy Council. The council shall in-4 $\mathbf{5}$ clude the following nonvoting ex officio members: 6 "[(a) The Superintendent of State Police; and] "[(b)] (a) The Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training, or a designee 7 8 thereof. 9 (b) A designee of the Oregon Health Authority who is involved with administering the 10 comprehensive emergency medical services and trauma system described in ORS 431A.050. 11 "(2) The State Fire Marshal shall serve as executive director of the council, but is not a mem-12ber. The council shall meet at least quarterly. The council shall select a chairperson and vice 13chairperson at the first council meeting of each odd-numbered year. The council may elect additional 14 officers as the council determines to be reasonable and necessary. 15 "(3) In addition to the ex officio members identified in subsection (1) of this section, the Gover-16 nor may designate a representative of the Governor to serve as a nonvoting member. The Governor 17 may also appoint not more than [nine] 12 members to serve on the council for three-year terms. In-18 itial terms of the appointed members may be adjusted to promote council stability. An appointed 19 member may not serve more than two consecutive terms. A member appointed by the Governor must 20 be a representative of one of the following: 21"(a) The Oregon Fire Chiefs Association or a successor or other organization representing fire 22chiefs. 23 (b) The Oregon Fire District Directors Association or a successor or other organization rep-24resenting fire district directors. 25"(c) The Oregon Fire Marshals Association or a successor or other organization representing 26 fire marshals. 27"(d) Property and casualty insurance providers. 28"(e) Employees of the Department of the State Fire Marshal. 29"(f) The Oregon State Fire Fighters Council or a successor or other organization representing 30 professional firefighters. 31 "(g) The Oregon Volunteer Firefighters Association or a successor or other organization repre-32senting volunteer firefighters. 33 "(h) The League of Oregon Cities or a successor or other organization representing munici-34 palities. 35(i) The Special Districts Association of Oregon or a successor or other organization 1 representing fire districts.

2 "(j) A representative of a structural fire response agency of a federally recognized 3 Oregon Indian tribe.

"(k) The Oregon Fire Service Office Administrators or a successor or other organization
 representing administrative personnel that serves Oregon fire service agencies.

"[(i)] (L) The general public.

"(4) Notwithstanding the term of office specified in subsection (3) of this section, the initial term
of a member appointed by the Governor may be adjusted to limit the number of member terms expiring in the same year.

"(5) To the extent funding is available from moneys appropriated to the Department of the State
Fire Marshal, a member of the council is entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in ORS
292.495.

"(6) The council shall advise the Governor and the [Superintendent of State Police] State Fire Marshal on fire policy issues and [serve in an advisory capacity to the State Fire Marshal on] strategies for the implementation of fire and life safety issues. The council may initiate advice to the State Fire Marshal[, the Superintendent of State Police] and the Governor on any matter related to the mission of the council. The council may not participate in the discussion of traditional labor relations issues.

"(7) The Department of the State Fire Marshal shall provide staff services to the council. All agencies, departments and officers of this state are directed to assist the council in the performance of its functions and to furnish information and advice as the council considers necessary.".

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
