## Senate Bill 945

Sponsored by Senator HAYDEN

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act provides Medicaid benefits for youth aging out of foster care. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.7).

Establishes medical assistance eligibility for individuals under age 26 who have aged out of foster care in Oregon or another state. Requires the Oregon Health Authority to seek federal matching funds for the costs of medical assistance provided to individuals who aged out of foster care in another state.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to foster children.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 414.
- 5 SECTION 2. Medical assistance shall be provided to an individual who:
  - (1) Is at least 18 years of age and not older than 25 years of age;
  - (2) Resides in this state;
  - (3) Was in foster care in the custody of any state on the date the individual attained 18 years of age; and
  - (4) Was enrolled in medical assistance in this state or another state while in foster care. SECTION 3. The Oregon Health Authority shall seek federal approval to secure the receipt of federal financial participation in the costs of providing medical assistance to individuals described in section 2 of this 2025 Act who were in foster care in another state.

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
