## Senate Bill 950

Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN, Representative NERON

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act makes some changes to the laws about sign language interpreters. The Act says the SBSLI can start two new types of sign language interpreter licenses. (Flesch Readability Score: 70.9).

Allows the State Board of Sign Language Interpreters to establish by rule criteria for the issuance of a supervisory sign language interpreter license or sign language interpreter license by endorsement. Directs the Health Licensing Office to issue a sign language interpreter-in-training license to a qualified applicant. Allows a specified person to provide signed language interpretation services on a temporary basis without a license. Directs the board to establish licensure fees. Repeals the specialty sign language interpreter licenses. Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

The Health Licensing Office [and Department of Education may] shall adopt rules with 36 37 the advice of the State Board of Sign Language Interpreters to carry out the office's [and the 38 department's] duties under ORS 676.750 to 676.789. SECTION 10. ORS 676.762, 676.765 and 676.768 are repealed. 39 SECTION 11. A license issued under ORS 676.762, 676.765 and 676.768 before the operative 40 date specified in section 12 of this 2025 Act is valid until the expiration date established by 41 the Health Licensing Office. The holder of a license issued under ORS 676.762, 676.765 and 42 676.768 may, on and after the operative date specified in section 12 of this 2025 Act, provide 43 signed language interpretation services in settings determined by the State Board of Sign 44 Language Interpreters. 45

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SECTION 12. (1) Sections 2 and 3 of this 2025 Act, the amendments to ORS 676.753, 1 676.756, 676.759, 676.771, 676.783 and 676.786 by sections 4 to 9 of this 2025 Act and the repeal  $\mathbf{2}$ 3 of ORS 676.762, 676.765 and 676.768 by section 10 of this 2025 Act become operative on January 1, 2026. 4 (2) The Health Licensing Office and the State Board of Sign Language Interpreters may  $\mathbf{5}$ take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is 6 necessary for the office and the board to exercise, on and after the operative date specified 7in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the of-8 9 fice and the board by sections 2 and 3 of this 2025 Act, the amendments to ORS 676.753, 676.756, 676.759, 676.771, 676.783 and 676.786 by sections 4 to 9 of this 2025 Act and the repeal 10 11 of ORS 676.762, 676.765 and 676.768 by section 10 of this 2025 Act. 12SECTION 13. This 2025 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2025

13 regular session of the Eighty-third Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
