PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2815

In line 2 of the printed bill, after "services" insert "; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 417.831"

3 Delete lines 4 through 9 and insert:

4 "SECTION 1. ORS 417.831 is amended to read:

5 "417.831. [(1) As used in this section:]

6 "[(a) 'Tribal advisory committee' means the committee established by the

7 Department of Early Learning and Care for the purpose of advising the Early

8 Learning Council on the Tribal Early Learning Hub.]

9 "[(b) 'Tribal Early Learning Hub' means the entity designated by the Early 10 Learning Council, in consultation with the tribal advisory committee, to coor-11 dinate early learning services provided to the tribal communities of this state, 12 as determined by rules adopted by the Early Learning Council in consultation 13 with the tribal advisory committee.]

¹⁴ "[(2) The Early Learning Council shall implement and coordinate a system ¹⁵ that coordinates the delivery of early learning services to the tribal communi-¹⁶ ties of this state through the direction of the Tribal Early Learning Hub. The ¹⁷ Tribal Early Learning Hub shall be separate and distinct from the Early ¹⁸ Learning Hubs designated under ORS 417.827.]

¹⁹ "[(3) The Department of Early Learning and Care shall establish a tribal ²⁰ advisory committee. The tribal advisory committee shall consist of 21 members ²¹ appointed by the Department of Early Learning and Care in consultation with 1 the nine federally recognized Indian tribes of this state as follows:]

2 "[(a) Two representatives from each of the nine federally recognized Indian
3 tribes of this state;]

4 "[(b) One representative from the Commission on Indian Services, who shall
5 be a nonvoting member;]

6 "[(c) One representative of the Early Learning Council, who shall be a 7 nonvoting member; and]

8 "[(d) One representative of the Department of Early Learning and Care,
9 who shall be a nonvoting member.]

"[(4) The tribal advisory committee shall advise the Early Learning Council on the delivery of early care and education services to the tribal communities of this state in a culturally specific manner. The Early Learning Council shall adopt rules related to the Tribal Early Learning Hub in consultation with the tribal advisory committee, including rules that prescribe the requirements for accountability and services provided.]

"(1) As used in this section and sections 2 and 3 of this 2025 Act:
"(a) 'Caregiver' means an individual who provides ongoing care for
a plan child.

"(b) 'Plan child' means a child enrolled in early childhood care or
 education programs who:

21 "(A) Is eight years of age or younger;

²² "(B) Is Native American or Alaska Native; and

"(C) Has experienced disproportionate results in early childhood
 care or education due to historical practices, as identified by the Early
 Learning Council by rule.

"(c) 'Tribal educator' means a teacher, child care provider, admin istrator or other school or child care employee who:

²⁸ "(A) Is Native American or Alaska Native; and

"(B) Provides early childhood care or education services to any
 children eight years of age or younger.

HB 2815-1 2/10/25 Proposed Amendments to HB 2815 "(2) The Department of Early Learning and Care shall develop and
implement a statewide early learning and care plan for plan children.
In developing the plan, the department shall:

"(a) In a manner consistent with ORS 182.164 and Executive Order
96-30, consult the nine federally recognized Indian tribes in Oregon and
state agencies with relevant expertise. Consultation under this paragraph must be undertaken with respect for tribal sovereignty, customs
and culture.

9 "(b) Solicit input from the advisory committee established under
 10 section 2 of this 2025 Act.

"(3) The plan developed and implemented under this section must,
 at minimum, address the following objectives:

"(a) Support the developmental, child care and educational needs
 and goals of plan children in a culturally appropriate manner.

"(b) Increase access for plan children to early learning system re sources and programs administered by the department.

"(c) Support culturally responsive curricula that honor the Native
 American experience in Oregon, including tribal history, sovereignty
 issues, culture, treaty rights, government, socioeconomic experiences
 and current events.

"(d) Improve early childhood development and kindergarten read iness for plan children.

"(e) Increase literacy and numeracy levels for plan children between
 kindergarten and grade three.

"(f) Provide education, training and professional development op portunities for educators and child care providers who serve plan
 children.

"(g) Foster parental and familial engagement in the development
 and education of plan children.

30 "(h) Support the preservation and revitalization of Native American

1 language and culture in Oregon.

"(4) The plan developed and implemented under this section may
 provide strategies to:

4 "(a) Support experiential curricula, including curricula on Native
5 American language and culture.

6 "(b) Increase the number of educators or child care providers who 7 are providing early childhood care or services to plan children.

"(c) Increase the number of tribal educators who are providing
early childhood care or education services to children eight years of
age or younger who are not plan children.

"(d) Prepare plan children for successful transitions, including from
 prekindergarten through post-secondary education.

"(e) Achieve any other outcomes identified by rule by the council
 in consultation with the nine federally recognized Indian tribes in
 Oregon.

"(5) The department shall establish and administer a grant program
 to award moneys to each of the nine federally recognized Indian tribes
 in Oregon for the purpose of implementing the objectives and strate gies of the plan described in this section.

"(6) The council, in consultation with the department, shall adopt rules necessary for the administration of this section, including rules establishing eligibility criteria for receipt of moneys under the grant program.

"<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Department of Early Learning and Care shall
 establish an advisory committee called the Oregon Tribal Early
 Learning Alliance. The advisory committee shall advise the depart ment on:

"(a) The development and implementation of the plan and grant
 program described in ORS 417.831.

30 "(b) The distribution of moneys for technical assistance, profes-

sional development, infrastructure or other support to plan children,
 caregivers, tribal educators or federally recognized Indian tribes in
 Oregon under section 3 of this 2025 Act.

"(c) Any other subject related to the delivery of culturally and linguistically appropriate early childhood care or education services to
plan children in this state.

"(2) The advisory committee shall consist of 18 voting members and
a minimum of nine nonvoting members. The department, in consultation with the nine federally recognized Indian tribes in Oregon, shall
appoint:

"(a) Two voting members from each of the nine federally recognized
 Indian tribes in Oregon.

"(b) At least two nonvoting members who are parents or caregivers
 of a plan child.

"(c) At least two nonvoting members who are tribal educators or
 providers of early childhood care or education programs that are op erated by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Oregon.

"(3)(a) In addition to the appointments made under subsection (2)
 of this section, the department shall appoint five nonvoting, ex officio
 members as follows:

"(A) One member who is the Early Learning System Director, or
 the designee of the director.

"(B) One member who is a representative of the Department of
Education.

"(C) One member who is a representative of the Department of
Human Services with expertise in the federal Indian Child Welfare Act
(25 U.S.C. 1901 et seq.).

"(D) One member who is a representative of the Oregon Health
 Authority.

30 "(E) One member who is a representative of the Higher Education

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"(b) In addition to the appointments made under paragraph (a) of this subsection, the Department of Early Learning and Care may appoint as a nonvoting, ex officio member a representative from any state agency.

6 "(4) The term of office and responsibilities of the members of the 7 advisory committee shall be determined by the advisory committee.

8 "(5) A majority of voting members of the advisory committee con9 stitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

"(6) Official action by the advisory committee requires the approval
 of a majority of the voting members of the advisory committee.

"(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Department of Early
 Learning and Care, in consultation with the nine federally recognized
 Indian tribes in Oregon, shall make an appointment to become effective immediately.

"(8) The advisory committee shall meet at the times and places
 specified by a majority of the voting members of the advisory com mittee.

"(9) The advisory committee may adopt rules necessary for the op eration of the advisory committee.

21 "<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The Tribal Early Learning Fund is established in 22 the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. In-23 terest earned on moneys in the Tribal Early Learning Fund must be 24 credited to the fund.

"(2) The fund consists of moneys appropriated or otherwise made
 available by the Legislative Assembly for deposit in the fund, interest
 earned on moneys in the fund and moneys otherwise deposited in the
 fund from any source.

29 "(3) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the De-30 partment of Early Learning and Care to carry out the statewide plan 1 and grant program under ORS 417.831.

2 "(4) To further the objectives and strategies described in ORS 3 417.831, the department shall retain up to five percent of the moneys 4 appropriated by the Legislative Assembly each biennium for deposit in 5 the fund to provide technical assistance, professional development, 6 infrastructure or other support to plan children, caregivers, tribal ed-7 ucators or federally recognized Indian tribes in Oregon.".

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
