## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2251

- On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:
- **"SECTION 1.** ORS 336.840 is amended to read:
- 4 "336.840. [(1) As used in this section, 'independent communication' means
- 5 communication that does not require assistance or interpretation by an indi-
- 6 vidual who is not part of the communication but that may require the use or
- 7 assistance of an electronic device.]
- 8 "[(2) Each district school board shall adopt policies for the use of personal
- 9 electronic devices in the schools of the school district as provided by this sec-
- 10 *tion*.]
- "[(3) A district school board shall adopt a policy for the use of personal
- 12 electronic devices that support academic activities and independent communi-
- 13 cations. The policy must provide that:]
- "[(a) Students may be allowed to use personal electronic devices that sup-
- 15 port academic activities and independent communications.]
- "[(b) Unless otherwise specifically prohibited by the policy, students may
- 17 not be denied the opportunity to use a personal electronic device that supports
- 18 academic activities and independent communications.]
- "[(4) If a school district implements a curriculum that uses technology, the
- 20 district school board shall adopt a policy that provides that:]
- "[(a) Students may be allowed, but are not required, to use their own per-

- 1 sonal electronic devices for the curriculum.]
- "[(b) Students who use their own personal electronic devices for the cur-
- 3 riculum must be granted access to any applications or electronic materials that
- 4 are available to students who do not use their own personal electronic devices
- 5 for the curriculum.]
- 6 "[(c) Students who use their own personal electronic devices for the curric-
- 7 ulum must be granted access to applications and electronic materials free of
- 8 charge if the applications and electronic materials are provided free of charge
- 9 to students who do not use their own personal electronic devices for the cur-
- 10 riculum.]
- "[(5) A policy adopted under subsection (3) or (4) of this section must in-
- 12 clude a process and timeline for responding to a student's request related to
- 13 the use of a personal electronic device, including an appeals process.]
- "[(6) School districts must ensure that the policies adopted under subsection
- 15 (3) or (4) of this section are made available to:]
- "[(a) School district personnel whose duties may require them to assist
- 17 students with personal electronic devices; and
- "[(b) Students and parents or guardians of students.]
- "[(7) Nothing in the requirements of this section prevents a district school
- 20 board from prohibiting:]
- "[(a) Telephonic or electronic communications during regular school hours
- 22 or during school events if the communications are not related to academic ac-
- 23 tivities or independent communications;
- "(b) Communications using access to social media or to nonacademic sites
- 25 during regular school hours or during school events;]
- 26 "[(c) The use of personal electronic devices for any purpose that does not
- 27 support academic activities or independent communications; or]
- "[(d) The use of personal electronic devices for entertainment purposes.]
- "[(8) Nothing in this section authorizes a district school board, or any em-
- 30 ployees of or volunteers for the school district or a school of the school district,

- to request, require or compel access to a student's electronic mail or personal online accounts.
- 3 "(1) As used in this section:

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- "(a) 'Personal electronic device' means a portable, electrically powered device that is capable of making and receiving calls and text messages and accessing the Internet independently from the school's network infrastructure.
- 8 "(b) 'Personal electronic device' does not include a laptop computer 9 or other device required to support academic activities.
- "(2) A district school board shall adopt a policy for the use of personal electronic devices by students.
  - "(3) Except as provided by subsection (4) of this section, a policy adopted under this section must prohibit the use of personal electronic devices by students from the start of regular instructional hours until the end of regular instructional hours, including passing time between classes and time provided for serving and eating meals.
- "(4) A policy adopted under this section must provide for the use of a personal electronic device by a student when the use complies with the terms of:
- 20 "(a) The student's medical provider's order for the care and treat-21 ment of a medical condition;
- 22 "(b) The student's individualized education program, as defined in 23 ORS 343.035; or
- 24 "(c) An education plan developed for the student in accordance with 25 section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. 794.
- "(5) The policy must provide consequences for a student's violation of the prohibition against the use of personal electronic devices under this section.
- "(6) A school district shall ensure that the policy is made available to:

- "(a) School district personnel; and
- 2 "(b) Students and parents or guardians of students.
- "(7) A school district that does not comply with this section is considered nonstandard under ORS 327.103.".

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
