PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 74

- Delete lines 4 through 8 of the printed bill and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) The Department of State Lands shall study the
- 3 effects of asserting title to existing submerged or submersible lands,
- 4 without regard to common law principles of accretion and avulsion,
- 5 after making a determination of navigability under ORS 274.404.
- 6 "(2) The study must include:
- 7 "(a) The impacts of an assertion of title described in subsection (1)
- 8 of this section on owners of private property, including the loss of land
- 9 value, the loss of access to land and effects on uses of land.
- 10 "(b) The economic and social effects on communities located near
- lands for which title has been asserted as described in subsection (1)
- of this section.
- 13 "(c) The legal and administrative costs associated with an assertion
- of title described in subsection (1) of this section, including potential
- 15 litigation costs.
- 16 "(d) Historical waterway boundary changes in this state due to na-
- 17 tural processes.
- 18 "(3) In conducting the study, the department shall:
- "(a) Consult with property owners, local governments and legal ex-
- 20 perts; and

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"(b) Hold public hearings in different regions of this state to provide

an opportunity for public comment. 1

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"(4) No later than September 15, 2026, the department shall submit 2 the department's findings in a report to the State Land Board and the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245. The report may include recommendations for legislation.".

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
